THE PATRIOT AND THE FARMERS.

The Patriot does not like THE EXAMINER'S references to the manner in which the Grit politicians and their press are endeavoring to hoodwink the farmers, and ridicules THE EXAMINER for being "anxious that the farmers shall not be fooled."

The new tariff bill introduced by Hon Mr. Foster seems to cause our contemporary considerable trouble. The bill does not suit its idea of what a measure of that description should be. In its estimation, the sympathy which the Finance Minister expressed for the farmers when the measure was submitted, has not materialized.

The new tariff, though a protective measure, is intended to be a reduction as compared with its predecessor, and its concessions are effected chiefly as a relief to the agricultural classes.

In two ways the tariff proposes reciprocal action on trade matters with the United States. It places timber, planks, laths, staves, hubs and like manufactures of wood on the free list, but provides that should any country tax such articles, the government-revenue may impose an export duty of \$3 per thousand on logs from Canada to such country.

Whenever the United States will admit any of these articles free, Canada will admit them on the free list. This, however, does not apply to barley and Indian corn, in regard to which Canada will not make a bargain in the one without including the other.
