he should have called it quits, but apparently he had fallen in love with his hand and he continued on to three notrump.

My double of three notrump was based much more on the faltering steps Forquet and Siniscalco had taken in reaching game than it was on the few high cards I held.

Siniscalco had already shown willingness to play at one, two, or three spades, while Forquet had been equally prepared to accept a pass of either his one or two notrump bids. Obviously, they were on shaky ground. Crawford was marked with some high card values and my hand could stand any lead he thought best. So I doubled.

Crawford decided to lead a heart. My king won and the queen of clubs returned was taken with the ace. A low diamond to Forquet's jack lost to the queen. We then cashed three spade tricks and the club king to defeat three notrump two tricks—500 points.

Our teammates stayed out of trouble on the hand. Rapee opened third hand with a spade. Silidor responded one notrump. Rapee then bid two spades and Silidor passed. Rapee made eight tricks to score 110 points.

So the United States gained 610 points (6 IMP) on the hand. In accordance with the European method of scoring in tournaments, a net gain of from 500 to 740 points on any deal brought an award of 6 international match points.

Opening lead—eight of hearts. Up to now we have given only hands where the Americans lost points to the Italian team. But the current world champions had their share of hard knocks also. Here is one where the Italians went wrong.

Forquet, who was throughout the match a tower of strength for the Italians, pushed the bidding a little too hard on this deal.

Having responded a notrump, over Siniscalco's spade bid, with maximum values, he tried to compensate by bidding two notrump over the spade rebid. When Siniscalco then bid three spades

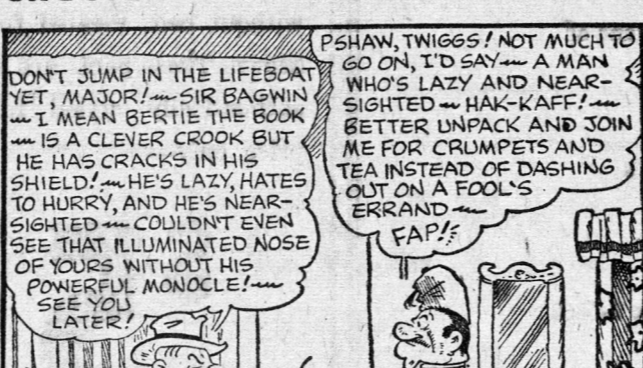

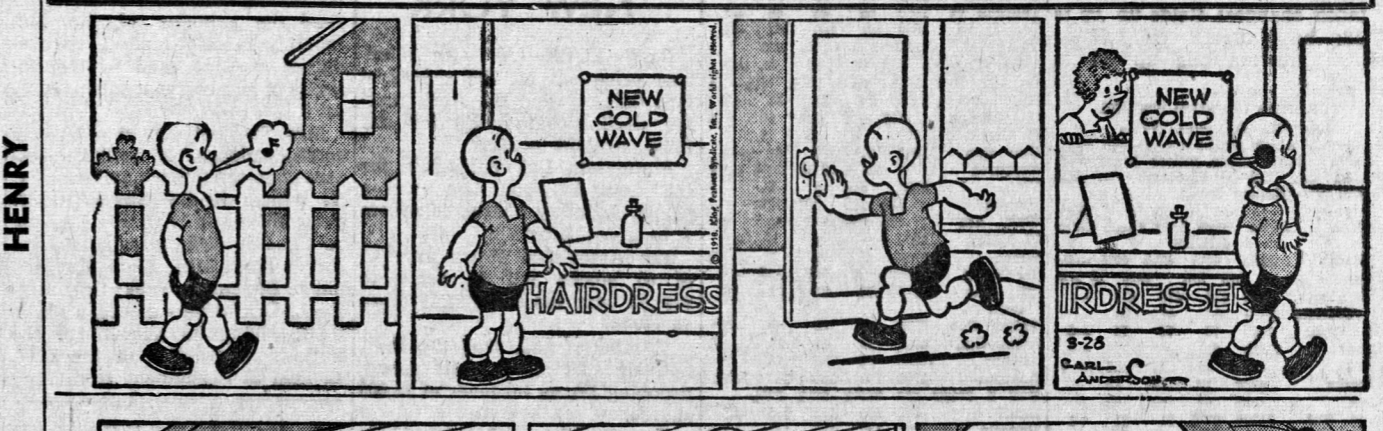
