Report Pictures Ministers 'Overloaded With Work'

OTTAWA (CP)—Federal cabinet ministers are overloaded and government machinery would work more efficiently if some of their powers were transferred to others, the Glasco Royal Commission said here in its fifth and final report. Winding up its monumental study of government organization, the three-man commission summarized its findings in a 3,600-word examination of how government action evolves from the political leadership through the civil service apparatus and into public field. It contained no hard blueprint for government operation, unlike the earlier massive reports that dealt with specific problems and departments. But it emphasized that freedom of operation is the key to improving the performance of the federal units and to this end the individual departments and agencies should be stripped of time-wasting red tape particularly in field operations. **REVIEW PROPOSALS** Maurice Lamontagne, president of the Privy Council, tabled the report in the Commons with a brief statement that said the government is "pressing forward" with a review of the Glasco recommendations.

French Paper In Moncton Plans Expansion Program

OTTAWA (CP)—Moncton's *l'Évangéline* will not only survive its financial difficulties but will go ahead with an ambitious expansion program as a result of a fund-raising campaign, it was announced here. The organizers of the drive said after a meeting here that they had collected more funds than they had originally hoped for. The amount raised is expected to be augmented by last-minute donations and will be announced July 12 at the annual meeting of the French-Language Daily Newspapers' Association of Canada in Montreal.

Aurele Gratton, president of the association and executive vice-president and general manager of *Ottawa Le Droi*, said *l'Évangéline* should be able to increase its circulation considerably and turn a profit within a few years.

Aldard Savoie, president of *l'Évangéline*, thanked the 5,000 donors, most of them from Quebec and Ontario, and the Quebec government which contributed a \$15,000 grant. He also thanked the French-Language Daily and Weekly Newspaper Associations for organizing the drive which opened March 18. Mr. Savoie said his newspaper, the only French-language daily east of Quebec City, has
