Sheraton Buys 9 More Hotels

OMAHA, Neb. (AP)—Sheraton Corp. of America, second largest hotel chain in the United States, Tuesday purchased 19 hotels from Eugene C. Eppley, midwest chainotel pioneer, for more than \$30,000,000.

In addition, Sheraton will operate three hotels for Eppley under license.

Among those purchased outright were the 1,500-room William Penn in Pittsburgh and the 500-room Leebach in Louisville, Ky.

The announcement was made jointly by Eppley and Ernest Henderson, president of Sheraton. Henderson said the sale price was "in excess of \$30,000,000."

He said the 22 hotels will be operated in the Eppley division of Sheraton Corp. with headquarters remaining in Omaha, where Eppley had operated from the Hotel Fontainebleau.

Sheraton now has 24,360 rooms in 54 hotels in the U. S. and Canada.

Hope Veteran Bush Pilot's Luck Holding

TORONTO (CP)—Carl Crossley, a weather-beaten bush pilot of 60 who stuck to flying long after many of his contemporaries retired to desk jobs on the ground, has had several narrow squeaks during 40 years as a pilot.

As search planes combed the Canadian Arctic on the fifth day since his disappearance while on a flight from a DEW-line site to Churchill on Hudson Bay, former flying companions and friends hope Crossley's luck is still with him.

Crossley, father of four children, whose wife lives at King, 10 miles north of Toronto, was returning a single-engine Norseman aircraft to Toronto when he vanished Saturday.

The plane had full emergency equipment aboard and enough food to last seven persons for 30 days.

Friends of the grey-haired veteran of two world wars, recalling the rickety planes and hazardous flying conditions of early bush flying which Crossley survived, say they still hope he will emerge from his latest scrape alive.

T. T. Lefebvre, managing director of Canadian Aircraft Renters, Ltd., owners of the plane, said he isn't too worried yet about Crossley.

"I've got a hunch he landed on a lake to wait out bad weather," he said.
