

Hail To All Wins Belmont Tom Rolfe Places Second

NEW YORK (CP)—Hail To All, a swift-closing Florida-bred colt carried jockey Johnny Sellers back into horse racing's spotlight in the Belmont Stakes Saturday with a neck triumph over Preakness winner Tom Rolfe, ridden by Canadian jockey Ron Turcotte.

Hail To All, owned by Mrs. Ren Cohen of Maryland, took the lead in the final strides and edged Tom Rolfe in a stirring four-horse finish in the \$147,000 race.

Lightly regarded First Family from C. T. Chenery's Meadow Stable was third, one length back.

The time for the mile-and-a-half race was 2:28.25. Turcotte, a 23-year-old native of Grand Falls, N.B., had no excuses for Tom Rolfe.

"We were in the clear all the way and when the real racing started through the lane we had the room we needed," said Turcotte, who was working as a \$50-a-week lumberjack in northern New Brunswick five years ago.

"The winner went by me one time coming to the eighth pole and then little Tom came on again but he just didn't make it."

Turcotte rode his first mount, Whispering Wind, June 21, 1961. He had his first winner at Fort Erie, Ont., April 9, 1962, aboard Pheasant King.

It was a sweet triumph for the lanky, 27-year-old Sellers. He had failed in four previous Belmonts but the most bitter setback was when Carry Back, another come-from-behind performer, wound up seventh in 1961 following triumphs in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, first two legs of the triple crown.

This year, Sellers had been

taken off Hail To All in the Kentucky Derby in favor of Manuel Yezza when trainer Eddie Yowell and Mrs. Cohen thought he had failed to get the most of the powerful stretch-runner in earlier races.

But he was back in Hail To All's saddle in the preakness and wound up third as Tom Rolfe edged the fast-closing Dapper Dan. Last Monday, he really started the long comeback by winning the Jersey with Hail To All.

GETS 10 PER-CENT
Saturday's victory at 10 per cent of the winning purse of \$104,150 earned Sellers \$10,415.

"He broke real well and I kept him off the early pace about fifth and let them go on," said Sellers. "I figured they'd come back. On the backstretch he worried me a bit as we were coming to the half-mile pole because he took the bit and moved up faster than I wanted. I didn't really set him down until past the quarter pole."

"He just outgamed Tom Rolfe to the wire."

Sellers added:
"Blinkers made a winner out of a loser."

Hail To All wore blinkers for the first time in the Jersey Derby.
