P. E. I. Department of Agriculture

The Potato Board

The Potato Board and the potato marketing scheme came into being on September 5, 1950, and the Board, for three years has been composed of three growers, and two dealers.

It is likely that provision will be made shortly, to double the size of the Board, by adding an additional grower from each county, and dealers from Prince and Kings.

The Board activities in the actual regulation of marketing have possibly been the subject of the major share of public discussion, but the fact should not be lost sight of, that it has an important role to play in advertising, promotion, and efforts to keep the industry in a strong position to compete for markets with other potato growing areas.

Accident Insurance

Federation members are reminded that applications for the group Accident Insurance are accepted at any time, and also that mishaps can easily occur between now and May 1st.

Already settlement has been made on a number of claims and those members have received a handsome return on their modest premium. This program is in no sense a money-making scheme for the Federation, but is offered as a service to its members and does serve to establish the possibilities of mutual aid through group action.

Present policy holders who suffer accidents are again reminded that the Federation office should be promptly notified of any accidents.

Scholarships

A golden opportunity awaits at least one boy in Canada to attend Agricultural College for four years at the expense of the T. Eaton Co., Ltd.

Each year one boy is selected from each Province and goes to the Royal Winter Fair where the scholarship winner is selected from among the 10 candidates.

Those eligible are boys not yet 23-years-old on October 20, who have finished high school, or are in the graduating year, but have not entered University. Applications should be forwarded before September 10, to C. C. Wright, Box 9, Charlottetown.

"Gatt"

At Geneva in 1947, Canada with 22 other countries negotiated the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade. (Gatt)

A second conference was held in 1949, in Ancey, France, and a third in 1951, at Torquay, U.K. It is likely that the coming winter will see a fourth round of negotiations take place, in a further attempt to arrive at a schedule of tariff concessions.

An important part of these agreements lies in the principle that if one nation gives a tariff concession to another that this concession automatically applies to all other members making up the Agreement.

To give an example the United States lowered the tariff on Canadian turnips for 12 1/2 cents to 6 cents per hundred lbs. This concession would then automatically apply to the other nations in spite of the fact that Canada had paid for the concession by an off-setting reduction in her tariff.


While many tariff concessions have been granted under the agreement, some countries for a variety of reasons are still applying restrictions on the quantities of imports, a noticeable example being the United States where import restrictions have practically nullified concessions granted at Geneva on dairy products.

Farm Forum

The week of November 2, will mark the beginning of the new Farm Forum season when groups meet to study the question of the farmer relationship with the field workers who represent Departments of Agriculture, and the various extensions departments of meeting with their neighbors.

of the French-peasant-soldier and silk merchant's daughter. So you see, the amazing prophecy made by Lenormand was fulfilled.

In 1885 a fairly large merchant ship called the Iron Mountain backed away from her berth at New Orleans, pointed her bow seaward and was never seen again. It remains an unsolved mystery to this day.

The U.S. Coast-guard cutter was playing her way through heavy seas in World War II when a


huge wave swept Lt. Comdr. R. W. Gathring from the deck. The ship turned about to attempt to save the man's life when a second, wave washed him back aboard.
