During the recent strike of dock workers in New York two small shipments of Russian furs, said to include Persian lamb, broadtail and foxes were sent back to England when longshoremen there refused to unload them.

A spokesman for Anglo-American Fur Corp. said all the merchandise had been offered and purchased at the September sales in London.

British imports of raw furs from the United States during the first nine months of 1956 totalled 1,800,956 pounds compared with 2,891,243 pounds for the corresponding period last year.
