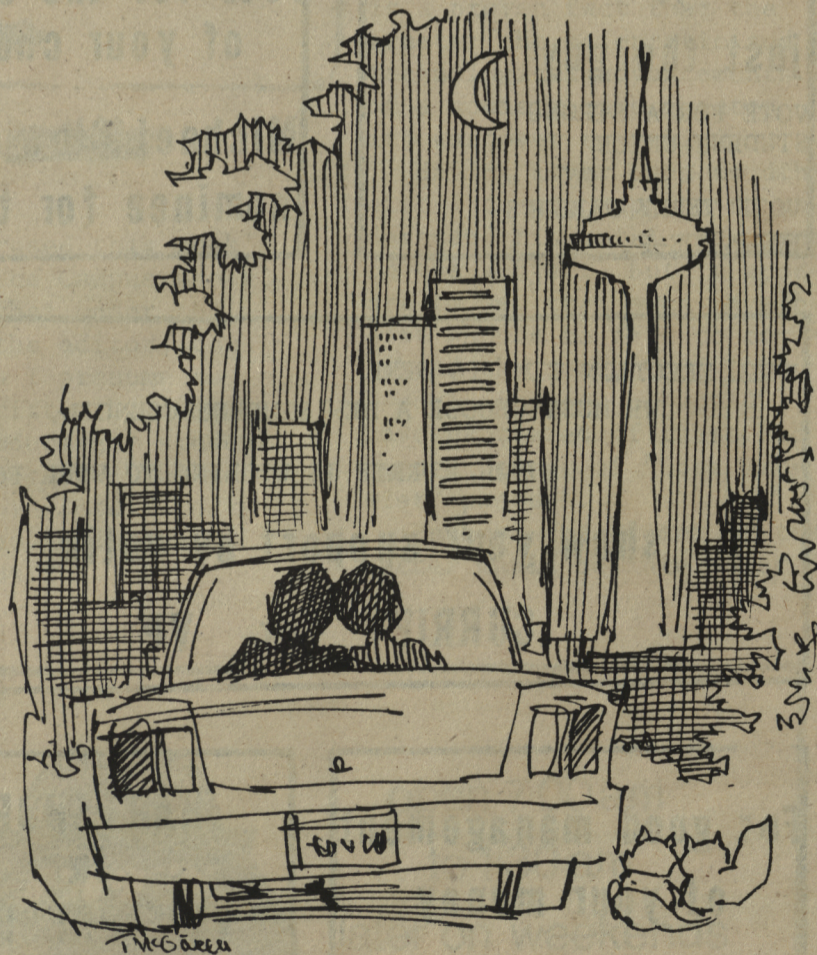
I'd also like to go to the beach, when its warm of course, and party. Like how many people would be up for bringing a bunch of gitars to some non-tourist beach and just have a sing song???
