**Local and Other Items.**

**COAL ARRIVALS.**—The following schrs. arrived within the past few days from Dominion Coal Co's mines C. B., with cargoes of coal to Peake Bros & Co viz Amazon, Cora Lee, Arthur, Sanjuan, Sir John McDonald, Mary Ann and Vivian.

**EAT STRAWBERRIES.**—Skin specialists are now advocating their patients to eat strawberries for a beautifying skin tonic. A dish of them for breakfast every morning and another at luncheon, are the directions. They contain more iron than other fruit, and are particularly good for any one suffering from nervousness.

**CURRENT.**—The summer tourist business last season was estimated to be worth over \$500,000. The hotel keepers receive by far the largest part of this money; and if they had enterprise enough to advertise thoroughly in Provincial and New England newspapers, they would probably double the patronage they already have from American tourists.—*Truro News.*

**PATENT REPORTS.**—The Canadian Patent office issued a total of 183 patents during the month of May 1899. Of this number 131 were granted to citizens of the United States; Great Britain 10; Germany 6; France, Switzerland, Sweden and Australia 1 each, and 33 to citizens of Canada. It may be worthy of mention that, exactly one half of all the patents granted to Canadian inventors were procured by one firm, Marion & Marion, of Montreal, the others being distributed among nearly 100 different firms scattered throughout the Dominion.

**ABOUT THE PHILIPPINES.**—Twelve hundred volunteers of Oregon and California have just returned home from Manila by the transports Newport and Ohio. On the arrival at San Francisco, of the transports stenographers were sent on board to take the answers of the returning soldiers to the following questions: First—Do you think the Philippines worth fighting for? Second—How long do you think it will take to conquer the rebels? Third—Would you live there if you could? Forth—What do you think of the natives?

The 1200 men were almost unanimous in saying that the expansion policy is proving a costly failure. It will take years, perhaps generations, to conquer the natives. The Filipinos, if eventually subjugated, will never make even moderately good citizens, and will be a source of common trouble and expense, necessitating a large standing army, with large garrisons on each of the more important islands to keep them in subjection. Few of them would care to return to the Philippines to live; and not one man could be found who would care to re-enlist.

The men are very bitter in their comments regarding the conduct of the campaign around Manila and the Oregonians declare that Major General Otis is a failure and that the campaign will be futile so long as the government delays sending out a competent general.

**LORD AND LADY MINTO.**—Lord and Lady Minto are not altogether popular with the Canadians, writes an Ottawa correspondent to an English newspaper, apropos of a recent public celebration in the Dominion capital. It was curious to note that Lord and Lady Minto were able to pass through a crowd of fifty thousand people unnoticed. It is said of Lady Minto that she has a patrician face; while of Lady Aberdeen the comment always was, "She has such a good motherly face." Lord Aberdeen had been called the "angel earl" by a penetrating people who are the best judges of character in the world. We have a new regime. It is a regime of reserve. It is distant and remote. It is not democratic. It is not frank. It is eminently dignified. It was said of the Aberdeens that they were not dignified enough. I have seen Lady Aberdeen dressed in the most dowdy manner. When the ladies of Montreal heaped up enormous bills during the stay of their Excellencies in Montreal, Lady Aberdeen appeared in public with the utmost simplicity. Some said that this was meant to rebuke the extravagance of the women. Others said that it was a lack of innate taste and refinement. But the voice of Lady Aberdeen was music. Her smile was cordial. To be simple was perhaps the expression of a great courage. The present regime certainly conforms with the monarchical idea. It is never familiar. Hence we miss the cheering crowds along the vice-regal path. This may, after all, be a little disconcerting too.
