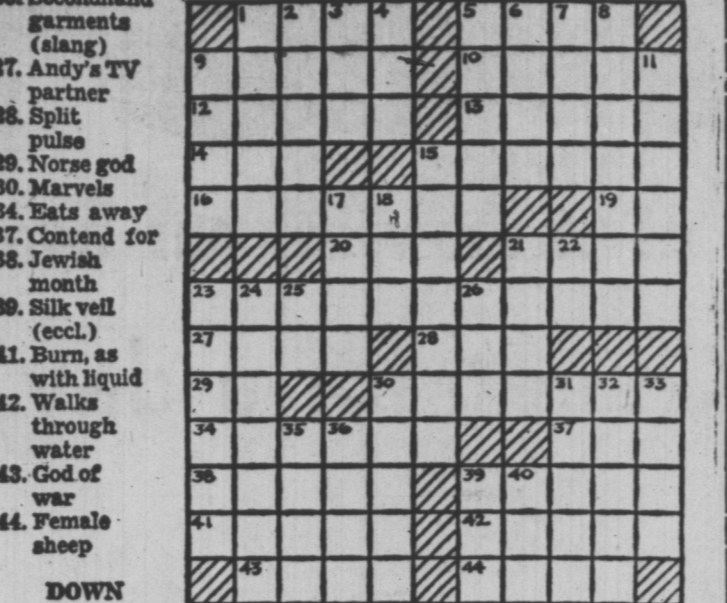

Political Victory Is Scored By Ike

WASHINGTON (Reuters)—President Eisenhower scored an important political victory last week when he withstood a major attack by the Democrats in Congress and emerged with his authority intact.
But his margin was so slim that the Democrats, encouraged by their near miss, are expected to strike new blows with increasing boldness in the coming weeks.
With the initial manoeuvring for the 1960 presidential election already under way, the president's opponents have given many signs that the truce with the White House has come to an end.
The issue on which the Democrats chose to reopen the struggle was a farm bill mainly significant as a political symbol.
The bill would have restricted the authority of Agriculture Secretary Ezra Benson over loans for rural electrification and thus represented a potential blow to the prestige of the Eisenhower administration.
The president vetoed the bill last Monday and within 24 hours the Democrats had mustered the two-thirds majority of the Senate necessary to vote in favor of overriding the veto.
But the Republicans rallied after their initial defeat. Party discipline prevailed, the Rep-

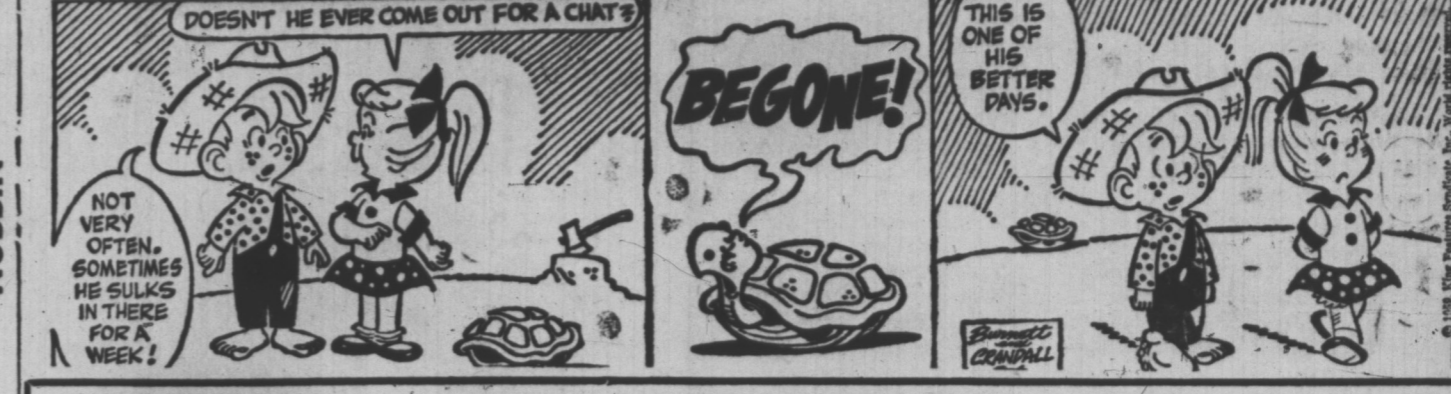

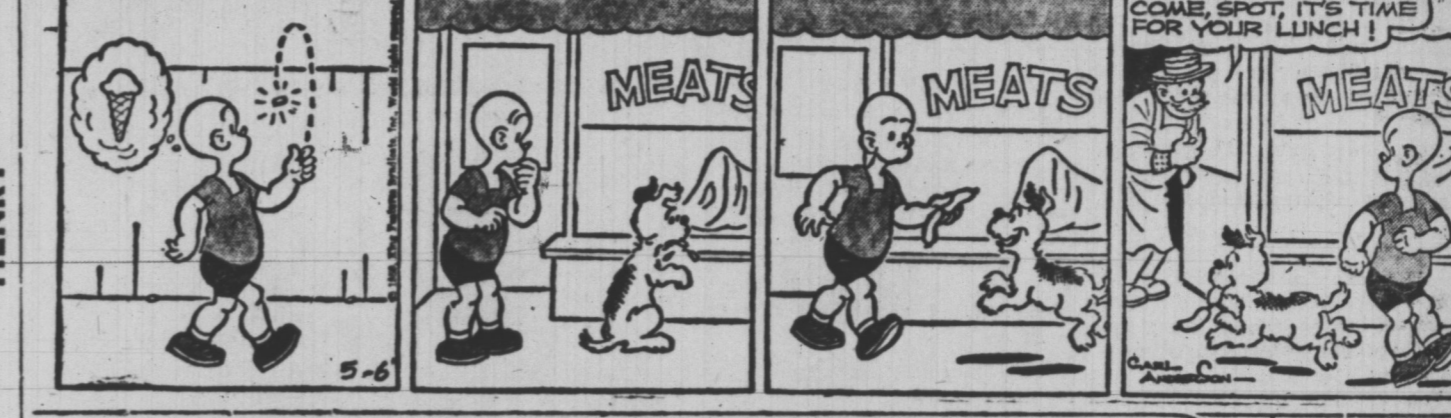


Red Trawlers Are Suspect

AONSET POINT, R.I. (AP)—Soviet fishing trawlers off the Grand Banks of Newfoundland may be just fishing there.
But they would be gathering intelligence for Soviet subs if the U.S. Navy officer in charge of a New England-based anti-submarine force were in the Russian Navy.
Rear-Admiral Robert J. Stroh, commander of task force Bravo, Sunday told a group of civilian leaders about the recent transatlantic phone cable cutting.
