Opening lead—six of diamonds.
 Just as the declarer in some hands finds it necessary to shift his line of attack as circumstances dictate, the defenders in the same way must frequently revise their plans to meet changing conditions.

West quite naturally opened a diamond, hoping this suit would prove to be the weakness in declarer's armor. East played the king and South again tried to hold. The jack was returned and declarer ducked again.

West's hand now sat redemptively on the board. He properly decided there was no future in continuing the diamond attack since he had no entry to the hand and South's ace of diamonds was driven out.
