so important a branch of the revenue, was first established in the short reign of Richard the Third. The plan was originally formed in the reign of his brother Edward, when stages were placed at the distance of twenty miles from each other, in order to procure the king the earliest intelligence of the events that passed in the course of the war which had arisen with the Scots; but Richard commanded in the expedition, and it is more to his sagacity and talents than to the merit of the invention ought to be given. In the reign of the latter the practice was extended over the greater part of the kingdom.

The Union forces, regulars and volunteers, now in the field and in the course of organization, amount, in round numbers, to 650,000, and will require the following amounts of provisions, &c. per month: 14,625,000 pounds of pork, or 24,375,000 pounds fresh beef; 136,894 barrels of flour; 48,750 bushels of beans, or 1,950,000 pounds of rice; 1,950,000 pounds of coffee; 2,892,500 pounds of sugar; 180,000 gallons of vinegar; 292,500 pounds of candles; 795,000 pounds of soap; 12,249 bushels of salt; 8,580,000 pounds of potatoes.

INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION, 1862.—Music.—It is understood that the musical arrangements for the opening of the Exhibition on the 1st of May next are well advanced. Four new works will be given, each by a different composer, representing the most musical nations in Europe. M. Mayerbeer will represent Germany; M. Auber, France; Signor Verdi, Italy; and Professor Spontini, England. It is said that the words of the English composition will be furnished by the Poet Laureate.

CATHOLIC YOUNG MEN'S LITERARY INSTITUTE.

"Pagan and Christian Civilization Contrasted," was the subject of the lectures last given before the Institute, by the Rector of St. Dunstan's College, Rev. Angus McDonald. The subject, though a vast one, was presented fully to the audience, in a succinct, learned, and eloquent manner. He gave a glowing description of the moral and political progress of the ancient nations, their literature, arts, architecture, and manufactures. He instanced their greatness in the works of human genius, which modern times have taken as models, and which have not been equalled. The stupendous buildings of the ancients, he said, were marvellous, such as the pyramids of Egypt and the great wall of China, which, as stated by the Asiatic Journal, and cited by the Rev. lecturer, contained more materials than all the buildings in Great Britain. The Rev. lecturer gave next a splendid description of the feasts and banquets of the Romans, and showed that they were intended for much of their greatness to the high civilization of Greece. The latter nation, he said, even though when subjected to Rome, was ever her intellectual mistress. The lecturer now gave the dark side of Pagan Civilization. He showed that the moral and political progress of the ancient nations was exposed to death in the most cruel manner—that the female sex was abused and degraded, and that the greater portion of the people, even in the most civilized states, were enslaved. He said that the Pagans had no benevolent institutions, and had very little social happiness. The contrast between this state of civilization and the Christian civilization, which encourages the moral virtues, protects children, honors women, liberates all mankind, and promotes social comfort, was eloquently drawn by the Rev. lecturer.
