Carr to speak at dinner

Shirley Carr, Executive Vice President of the Canadian Labour Congress will be the guest speaker at a banquet at UPEI on Wednesday, November 30. The banquet, which is open to the public, marks the conclusion of a six-part lecture series entitled "Women and Unions".

Shirley Carr first became active in the Labour movement in the 1960s, in the Canadian Union of Public Employees. She served in various capacities at the local, provincial and national level while employed on-line with the Regional Municipality of Niagara in the Social Services Department.

Engineering acceptances cut

At its meeting on November 18, Senate voted to reduce acceptance to the first year engineering program at UPEI from 70 to 65, in an attempt to keep final class enrolment under the level of 50 students.

The suggested figure was 60 acceptances, in light of present over-crowded conditions in the department and the slim chance of getting extra funding to increase resources. In the interest of open admissions, however, a compromise at 65 was reached.

Solidarity mass on Sunday

A Solidarity mass for the struggles of the Grenadian and El Salvadorean people will be held at the Chaplaincy Centre on Sunday, November 27 at 6:30 p.m. The Mass will remember those who have died in the pursuit of freedom and justice. Special guest will be Armando Peredes who is visiting UPEI through the sponsorship of the Canadian Federation of Students and our Student Union. This special liturgy will be followed by a Pot Luck Supper at 7:30, sponsored by the Central American Information Group. Tickets are \$2.00 and can be picked up from Father Phil Callaghan. The University Community is also invited to a public meeting with Mr. Peredes on Monday.
