NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market started out Thursday with a higher look but finished with prices mixed.
Railroads and steels led the original rise, and then both faded from the picture. At the close, chemicals were in the forefront. Depressed, with steels and railroads were rubbers, aircrafts, radio, televisions, coppers, electronics issues and utilities. Others were mixed, although a few displayed some good plus signs.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up 30 cents at a new high of \$172.80, the 11th new high in 14 sessions. The industrials component, which includes Du Pont, gained \$1.00 at a new high of \$237.10. Ralls held unchanged and utilities fell back 10 cents.
Canadian issues were mostly higher. Canadian Pacific, Hiram Walker and Distillers Seagram all gained 1/8. McIntyre fell 1/8 while Dome and International Nickel both remained unchanged.
On the American stock exchange, Giant Yellowknife was up 1/4 and Royalite Oil slipped 1/4. Lake Shore remained unchanged.
