## Gorman Leads Xaverians To 40-14 Rout Of Hawks

**TORONTO (CP)**—Terry Gorman, a stocky speedster from nearby Newmarket who went to the Maritimes to continue his education; had football fans here Saturday wondering how he ever got away.  
 Perspiration rolling from his brow beneath blonde, close-cropped hair, the 22-year-old Arts student at St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, N.S., was justifiably elated with his efforts after catching three touchdowns passes in the X-men's crushing 40-14 win over Waterloo (Ont.) Lutheran University for the Vanier Cup in the second College Bowl game.

"It was my greatest game," admitted the usually reserved Gorman whose father, Peter, is one of the original committee members who founded the College Bowl, the proceeds of which go to the Canadian Save the Children Fund.  
 Gorman was on the receiving end of six passes from quarterback Terry Dolan of Calgary, Alta., gained 131 yards, intercepted 146 key passes, and played 60 solid minutes of football.

His performance earned him the unanimous choice as the game's outstanding player, selected by a panel of sportswriters and sportscasters.  
**WATERLOO RECOVERS**  
 While the score was mounting in favor of the X-men, what might have become a rout instead became a bruising, fiercely competitive game after Waterloo finally got on the scoreboard just before half time.

Paul Brule, who set a Blue-nose conference scoring record this year of 120 points, illustrated to over 7,000 fans here why X-men's opposition considers him dangerous whenever and wherever he has the ball.  
 The 180-pound plunger from Ottawa carried the ball 33 times from scrimmage for 172 yards and scored twice, including a 38-yard smash through the centre of the line during which he spun or shook off several would-be tacklers.

**'HIT HARD'**  
 However, while he wasn't impressed with Waterloo's offence, Brule praised the Golden Hawk's defensive unit which slowed up St. FX's running in the second half.  
 "They (Waterloo) hit terribly hard," said Brule, noting several tender spots on his body where blitzing Lutheran defenders had knifed past his blockers to stop him.  
 More than 14,300 tickets were sold for the game, sponsored by the Canadian Save the Children Fund.

 The long-awaited battle between Notre Dame and Michigan State for the national college football championship ended in anti-climatic frustration for both teams Saturday as they fought to a 10-10 tie.  
 The Irish were crippled when their starting quarterback, Terry Hanratty, left the game with a shoulder injury in the first quarter and half back Nick Eddy stayed on the sidelines, also with a shoulder injury.  
 But Coley O'Brien, Hanratty's sophomore substitute, moved Notre Dame to the tying points after Michigan State had taken a 10-0 lead in the first half. He hit Bob Gladieux, Eddy's replacement, with a 34-yard scoring pass in the second period, and Joe Azzaro's 28-yard field goal on the first try of the final quarter tied the game.  
 Michigan State's touchdown came in the second quarter when Regis Cavender, playing for injured fullback Bob Apisa, ran for four yards after quarterback Jimmy Raye had moved the Spartans up close with a

## Varsity Defeats Schooners 102-83

Saint Dunstan's University Varsity Basketball Saints, led by veteran Owen Jay, and classy Freshman guard, Danny Theriault, with 25 points apiece ran roughshod over a strong Saint John Schooner's team in Alumni gymnasium Saturday afternoon.  
 The score, 102-83, was the highest total for the Saints in six years, and only the second time in history that they have scored more than a hundred points.  
 The Schooners took an early lead of eight points, but faltered halfway through the first quarter, allowing the Saints to get several quick field goals to take a lead they never relinquished.  
 Aside from the strong showing by Jay and Theriault, the whole game was a team effort, unique in Saint Dunstan's basketball history. Ronnie Diamond and Mike Sullivan scored twenty and eighteen points respectively to help with the victory. Allan Connolly played a strong game on defense. Veteran forward Eddie Lavlor was playing with a bad ankle, that forced him to retire early in the game.  
 The schooners were led by guard Ken Gould with twenty-six points. Second high man for the Saint John team was forward Brian White with twenty.  
 The Saints were the smaller of the two teams, spotting the opposition at least two inches every position. At centre, the height discrepancy was closer to five inches, however, the Saint Dunstan's team made up for this disadvantage by hustling all the way, and never giving the other team a chance to get set.
