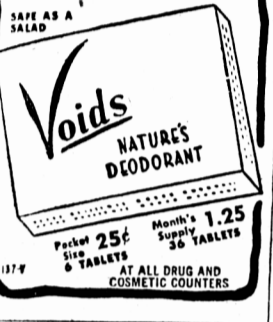

Indeed the finding of a Catbird's nest generally means calamity for the owners. Should you be observed, or leave any indication that you were there, the pair desert, and if the season is not too far advanced, start up house-keeping elsewhere. The worst mistake on your part is to leave a trail of trampled grass and broken branches, because this provides information, and so leads marauders to the spot.

The nestlings are brought up on soft fruits and insects, and are taught, from the beginning, to behave so as to avoid detection. They are rarely seen while still at home. It pays to obey parents.

Once at the juvenile stage, Catbirds are still more elusive. They have inherited the secretive nature of their ancestors, and their colouring is such that they are hard to see even in a good light as they jump from branch to branch low down in the bushes.

Though showing a strong resemblance to their father and mother, their grey coats are slightly darker. Their voices too, are much the same by this date, when Mr. Catbird has given up singing his varied song. Unfortunately, he has taught the young ones the calls from which he has earned his name, that very unmusical "wah" and "meow".

Another deplorable habit of all Catbirds is making a noise that sounds remarkably like spitting. But for this they must be forgiven, as no offense is meant. Do tails tell tales?

Water Babies Not Permitted To Swim

LE TREPONT, France, Aug. 8 (AP) — Russel Tongay and his water babies, Bubba, 5, and Kathy, 4, left by train tonight for Paris, apparently abandoning their attempt to make a sneak swim across the English Channel.

The Tongays, of Miami, Fla., came to Europe with the intention of having the children make a try at the channel. Both Britain and France denied them permission to take off from either shore.

Tongay then said they would get a boat and go fishing in the Channel. He indicated that if the children wanted to take a swim, and should point toward England, there could be no objection to that. He said yesterday the boat might leave Dieppe today for the fishing trip.

MRS. WALTER CUSACK

Friends and neighbours of Mrs. Walter Cusack were both saddened and shocked to learn of her sudden passing on the evening of July 1st, 1951, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. James P. Berrigan, North Wiltshire. She was fortified by the last rites of the Roman Catholic Church by the Reverend Father Bolger, St. Dunstan's Basilica.

The late Mrs. Cusack was born in County Kerry, Ireland, in the year 1881, from whence she emigrated to Boston, Mass., at an early age. She later moved to Brookline with her husband where they were respected residents of Kelly's Cross Parish for more than thirty-five years.

Agnes, as she was familiarly known made friends quickly in this strange land and became a general favorite with young and old. The large member of Mass. Cards, Spiritual Bouquets, Messages of Sympathy, Wreaths and Telegrams received bore testimony of her kind, generous and lovable character.

Her funeral which was largely attended was held from the home of her daughter, Mrs. Berrigan to St. Ann's Church, Lot 65, where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Reverend George McCormac. In the Sanctuary were Reverend Kenneth McMillan and Reverend Ralph Malone. The remains were then transferred to Charlottetown where all that was mortal of a kind and loving wife and mother was tenderly laid to rest in the Roman Catholic Cemetery, there to await a Glorious Resurrection. Father Patrick McMahon officiated at the grave.

The pallbearers were Patrick McGee, James Monaghan, Albert Smith, Kier Hatherley, Warburton Godfrey and Raymond Berrigan. May her soul rest in peace.
