TORONTO (CP)—Camille Henry scored two goals Wednesday night to lead New York Rangers into first place in the National Hockey League as Rangers stretched their undefeated streak to five games with a 4-2 victory over Toronto Maple Leafs.

Henry broke a 2-2 tie midway through the third period with his first goal of the season with both teams at full strength. He opened the scoring in the first period with his seventh goal while playing in the Ranger power play. He leads New York scorers.

A crowd of 12,000 saw Leafs come from behind a 1-0 deficit to tie the score 1-1 by the end of the first period, then take a 2-1 lead shortly after the midway mark of the second.
