Sir Charles III. OTTAWA, April 27. Sir Charles Tupper is seriously ill.

The Factories Act.

Sir Leonard Tilley, yesterday, introduced the Factories Act. It provides that proprietors of Factories shall always maintain a safeguard against fire and accidents. The employment of women and children at work, which is in any manner injurious to the health, is, by the Bill, made illegal.

The Militia Act.

Hon. Mr. Caron, yesterday, moved the third reading of the Militia Act. Mr. Ross moved an amendment against the proposed infantry and cavalry corps. It was lost and the Bill passed.

Railway Explanation.

Owing to the illness of Sir Charles Tupper, the Railway explanation has been postponed for a few days.

El Medhi Defeated.

CAIRO, April 27. The False Prophet—El Medhi—attacked Dunne in the Soudan, on the 24th inst., and was defeated.

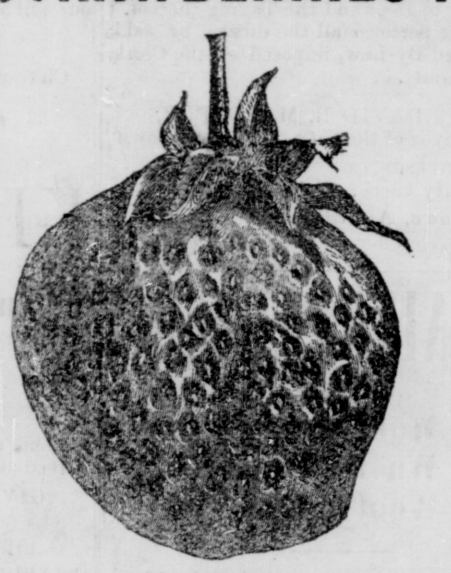
