

Sees Better Outlook For N.S. Coal Sales In Ont.

AMHERST (CP) — Dominion Coal Board chairman W. E. Uren said here Sunday operational efficiency and co-operation of miners may soon enable the Dominion Coal Company to compete more vigorously in the central Canadian coal market.

He said the company, a subsidiary of the Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation, was not competing with United States producers "on quality, but on price." Efficient full-time production would reduce costs and put it into "a more competitive and wider market."

Mr. Uren arrived here Sunday with federal Mines Minister Comptois. They will spend a week visiting coal operations on mainland Nova Scotia, Cape Breton and New Brunswick.

May Be Shake-up In Food, Farm Products Trade Policy

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada and other world trading powers may be heading for some kind of reform or shake-up in international rules dealing with trade in food and other farm products.

While no radical departures are foreseen on the Canadian side, the moves that may be taken in the next few months could lead to shifts in policy in the use of high price supports, import embargoes and so-called "waivers" to ignore negotiated tariff bargains.

The whole issue is likely to arise at the next meeting of the 37-country General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade which opens at Geneva Oct. 16.

AWARE OF SPLIT
In a letter to Eisenhower, the 91-year-old senator had warned of division at home and abroad if the government persisted in a course of firm support for the Chinese Nationalist defence of the coastal islands of Quemoy and Matsu.

In a speech at Providence, R.I., Tuesday, Green said the Eisenhower policy was not supported by a 1955 congressional resolution authorizing the use of American forces to help defend Formosa.

The tone of Eisenhower's reply was brusque and at times almost angry.

AIMED AT CRITICS
Publication of the letter left no doubt that he aimed it for a wide audience of both critics and supporters.

"I deeply deplore the effect upon hostile forces of a statement that if we became engaged in battle, the United States would be defeated because of disunity at home."

Eisenhower asserted Green is misinformed if he thinks America's allies would not approve U.S. action in standing up against Communist armed assault.

"Not only do I believe that our friends and allies would support the United States if hostilities should tragically and against our will be forced upon us, I believe that most of them would be appalled if the United States were spinelessly to retreat before the threat of Sino-Soviet armed aggression."

TIMELY NOTES ON FUR FARMING

A short time ago we made mention of Fromm Brothers, Hamburg, Wisconsin, who in the years between 1940 and 1950 continually enlarged their ranches until they were producing in the vicinity of 40,000 silver fox pelts a year. In the succeeding years silver fox became more difficult to sell, one of the reasons being the advent of closed cars and the prominence that was given to mink. Eventually they had to pull all but a nucleus of their breeding stock.

Recently they have been advertising with display photos, featuring beautiful silver fox pelts that are now being marketed. We sent a clipping of our recent story on Fromm Bros., that appeared in the Guardian, to Edward Fromm, president of the company, and received the following letter:

NEAR REVIVAL
"Lt. Col. D. A. MacKinnon, Charlottetown, P. E. I. Dear Sir — It was indeed a pleasant surprise to receive the copy of the Charlottetown Guardian last week that you were so kind to mail us. To us older generation of fox men, whose pride in the beauty of our lovely foxes has been so abused throughout these many years of woman's neglect, it is gratifying to finally see a bit of life in foxes again."

Our emphasis during the quiet years has been on the development of new colors. In this we have had a good measure of success. Your recount of shows and prize animals in Prince Edward Island fox history brings back to mind the most exciting years in all fur farming history.

Several times we have mentioned how chinchilla, that was looked on as a "fad" fur a few years ago when the little inhabitants of the Andes Mountains were brought to United States for breeding purposes has increased in popularity and is now considered one of the ultra-fashionable furs.

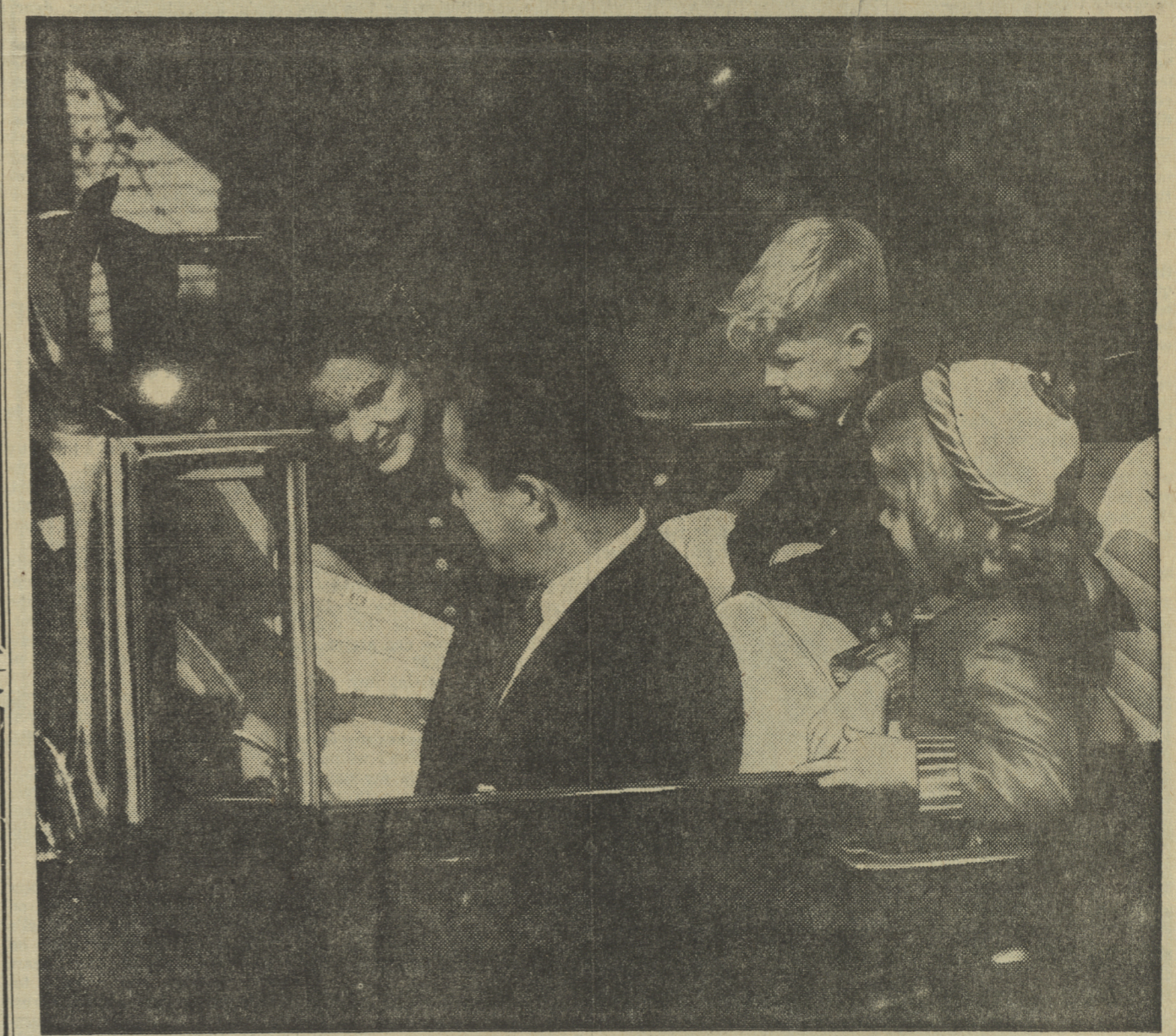
