**THOMAS B. GILLESPIE**

After a long and a serious illness there passed to his rest, on February 22nd, one of Charlottetown's long and most highly respected citizens, Thomas B. Gillespie in his 73rd year.

The late Mr. Gillespie, who was well known in Charlottetown and surrounding districts for his interest in community life and in all the activities pertaining to community life, for his deep and active interest in the Conservative Party and for his steadfastness to his church and his teaching of which church he was an elder, was a son of the late James and Sarah Campbell Gillespie.

During the trying times of his illness, the late Mr. Gillespie showed forth the sterling qualities of his outlook upon life; his illness was borne with Christian patience in reconciliation and resignation to the will of God, not fearing the end of his earthly sojourn, trusting fully and solely in the merits of his Saviour.

The funeral which was very largely attended was held on February 25th. Services being conducted by his pastor, the Rev. J. H. Bishop, Minister of The Church of Scotland, assisted by Rev. Horace MacEwen of the Bible Presbyterian Church and Rev. Theodore Ross of the United Church, and a life long friend of the deceased, the Rev. J. H. Bishop, read the 23rd and 20th psalms and 55th paraphrase were sung, and a favorite psalm of the late Mr. Gillespie, psalm 103 was read. The pastor chose for his text, Isaiah, Chapter 60, verse 19.

The pallbearers were: Sheldon Nicholson, Ralph MacCaul, Earle Sawyer, Harry MacFarlane, Leonard MacCarville and John Haslam.

Burial was in the Church of Scotland cemetery at Cape Traverse.

Besides a sorrowing widow, the former Mamie Lefurey, who devotedly cared for her husband during his illness, there are left to mourn one daughter, Doris, Mrs. Hazen MacWilliams of Cape Traverse; two sons, Hazen on the old homestead in Charlottetown, and Gordon in Montreal; two granddaughters Diane and Susan Gillespie of Charlottetown and Montreal respectively; also three sisters, Euphemia, Mrs. Rev. D. M. Campbell of Saskatoon, Sask.; Rebecca of Charlottetown; and Sarah Jane, (Mrs. Ernest MacLaren) of Toronto, Ont. A brother, William of Charlottetown, passed away since the death of his brother. These two brothers were greatly devoted to each other, "they were lovely in their lives, and in death were not divided."

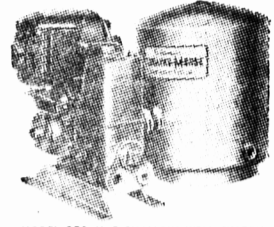

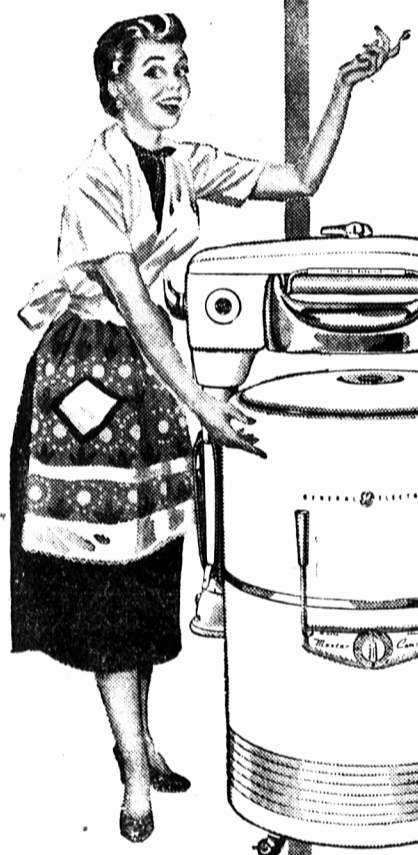

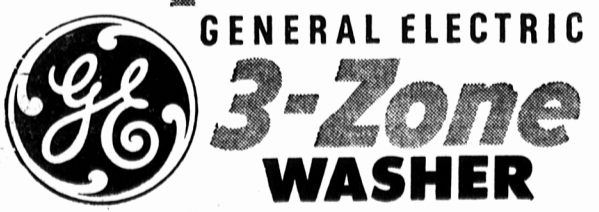
