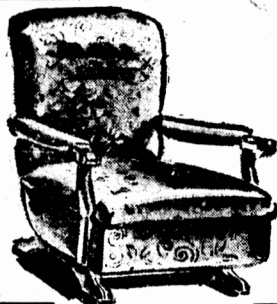

QUESTIONS OF PRIVILEGE.—The reference in yesterday's Guardian to a \$363,562 surplus by the Provincial Government on current account for the year ending March 31, 1950, should have read \$233,562, as was apparent from the published totals. This was pointed out on a question of privilege in the Legislature yesterday by Hon. A. W. Matheson, who also disclaimed having stated "Nobody spoke about it," as quoted in the discussion on the Ottawa proposal for a Provincial sales tax. Mr. Bell said he had stated that the M.V. Eakins carried "only several hundred tons" of cargo last season, not 200 tons as reported. He was later taken to task on this point by Premier Jones, who said that over 4,000 tons had been carried, and that the Opposition leader's reference to a crew of fifteen or more, and a ground crew of six or eight, was also incorrect.
