Hi there!

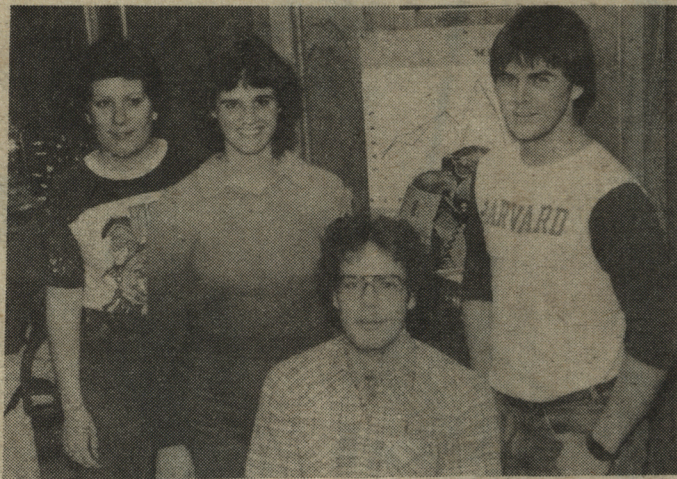
