MINING

TORONTO, Aug. 9 (CP)— Mining shares hit the skids today on the Toronto market and closed about a point down in the index, closing at the lowest level of the year. Industrials also were off at noon but they improved their position in the afternoon trade to show a net loss of only .13 in the index. Western oils declined .26. Volume at 24,000 shares was the smallest in nearly two weeks.

Banks

Base Metal shares showed the widest loss with an index drop of 1.07. Smelters lost 1.44. Hudson Bay and Nickel 1.4 each, and Noranda 1.2. Nickel was off to 48 1-2 in the last hour and recovered to 49 before the close.

MONTREAL, Aug. 9—Receipts on the Montreal livestock markets today were 41 cattle, 256 hogs and 40 calves. Cattle and hogs were steady. Veal calves stronger. There were no top steers. Medium quality sold around \$6. A few fair heifers made \$4.50. Good butcher cows were mostly \$5 with medium \$4 to \$4.50 and common butchers down to \$3. Canners and cutters were \$2.50 to \$2.75. Good veal calves were higher. Good small lots up to \$8 with odd kinds around \$7. Common veals sold down to \$5.50. Grassers were mostly \$4.

Produce Prices

MONTREAL, Aug. 9—Potatoes recovered part of yesterday's losses on open produce markets here today, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Eggs, cheese and butter offerings all eased slightly in quiet trading. Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 22 1-3 to 3-4 cents a pound and solids for 22 to 21-4. Western butter delivered in Montreal was unquoted. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale jobbing lots made 21 3-8 to 1-2. Ontario white and colored cheese were both quoted at 11 3-8. Quebec white and colored were both quoted at 10 5-8. Graded egg shipments in used free cases sold at 27 to 27 1-2 cts. for A-large, 25 1-2 to 26 for A-medium, 19 to 20 for B-large, 14 1-2 to 15 for C. Potatoes: Quebec new crop 75's No. 1 85 to 75; Quebec new crop No. 2 75's 55 to 65.

TANKAGE VERSUS FISH MEAL FOR BACON HOGS

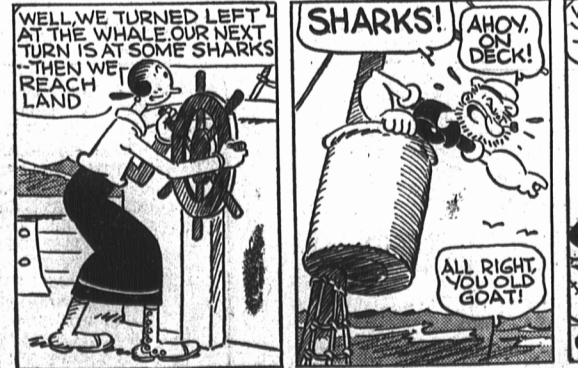
(Experimental Farm News)
In feeding experiments during the past several years at the Dominion Experimental Farm, Nappan, N. S., writes C. D. S. Cameron, comparisons were made of the value of tankage and fish meal as protein supplements in the bacon hog ration. A comparative feeding test completed during the early fall of 1938 illustrates the type of results obtained. In this experiment two uniform lots of five hogs each were fed indoors on a similar basal meal mixture consisting of 20 pounds of barley and 150 pounds each of oats and shorts, plus 50 pounds of tankage to one lot and 43 pounds of fish meal to the other. Until an average live weight of 100 pounds per hog was reached, the protein feeds were then reduced to one-half this amount in the basal feed mixture until the hogs were finished at about 200 pounds live weight. At the end of the trial the hogs showed an average gain of 1.51
