12 Killed As Train Hits Truck

ROCKY FORD, Colo. (AP)—A 56-car freight train jammed into a light truck jammed with 17 farm laborers Tuesday, killing 12. Five others were injured, three of them seriously. A scene of horror was spread 300 feet along the right-of-way just west of Vroman, a farm settlement about six miles from Rocky Ford, centre of a melon, sugar beet and onion growing area in southeastern Colorado's Arkansas River valley. "Bodies, arms, legs and heads were strewn along the railroad right of way," said Jack Lee of road station KBNZ at La Junta.
