SANTA TERESA (AP)—Deep in the heart of Colombia, a country of mountains, Andes peaks and fertile valleys, the tough, well-trained Colombian army is fighting banditry and subversion. Rural violence has plagued Colombia more than 24 years. The nation's armed forces, supported by U.S. aid and command, led by the military minister, Maj. Gen. Alberto Ruiz Novoa, seem to be the country's last hope for the "bandoleros," the remnants of Colombia's 10-Moody years of interparty warfare. They say victory is in sight.
