WOOL GROWERS ATTENTION!

As advertised recently an advance payment of \$1.00 per pound based on current market values was announced on wool delivered to the Sheep Breeders' Association warehouse. During the past ten days wool markets have deteriorated and the advance payment now stands at seventy cents (70c) per pound. This figure may change, up or down, as full market values change. It must be remembered that the advance payment is only a part of the full payment that the grower will finally receive. It has always been the practise to reserve a substantial payment for the final settlement after wool has been graded. The announcement of the Sheep Breeders' Association already appearing in the press has had the effect of strengthening and stabilizing the wool prices in the Province, purchased through ordinary channels. Your own Association, the Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers, is in close touch with markets, and through its experienced marketing facilities guarantees the highest price for your product. Market your wool through the Prince Edward Island Sheep Breeders' Association. Do not assume that markets have drastically weakened because of the lower advance price.
