

Current Notes.

The loss of life in the last fifteen years arising from casualties at sea to British ships in the home and foreign trade, excluding fishing vessels, foots up 39,414, of which 3,372 is the total for 1881-2, this being the largest in any single year. Collisions caused the loss of 5,178 lives.

Besides 450 detectives, there will be at Moscow during the coronation time, a special inner circle of 10 secret police agents, directed by Gen. Teheverine. They comprise 1 Russian, 3 Italians, 1 Belgian, 1 Dane, 1 Englishman, 1 Frenchman, 1 German, and 1 Swiss, and are selected from their intimate knowledge of the Socialist element in their respective countries.

Ex-Senator Conckling, the statesman, Charles A. Dana, author, journalist and scholar, with a number of leading men in New York, gave the cheer of their presence and the light of their smile to the big fight between Sullivan and Mitchell. The big men and the little men all shouted loud and long when the big man pounded the little man all around the lists. It was a Roman holiday, butcher, audience, and all.

France and China are swiftly drifting in the direction of war. The Chinese are not the simple people they were when they fought England. China is getting big guns from Germany and a first-class campaign machinery. The French can kill off a few million of the heathen Chinese without weakening the nation much. The Chinese have a good navy and will make a long fight if they like.

It will be curious if the Brooklyn Bridge unite New York and Brooklyn finally under one government. The idea broached at the Chamber of Commerce banquet seems to gain strength, many people believing that there is "no reason for having two civic administrations for communities that are substantially one." Would Brooklyn be considered a suburb of New York or would it lose its name under the grand New York?

The suicide of Amasa Stone, the Cincinnati millionaire, has recalled a disaster and a tragedy to recollection. It appears that soon after the fall of the bridge at Ashtabula, Ohio, a few years ago, by which so many lives were lost, an attempt was made to show that Charles Collins, the Chief Engineer of the Lake Shore Railway, was responsible for the disaster. Mr. Collins resented the imputation, and proved before the Legislative Committee, which exonerated him, that he had advised against the construction of the bridge under the plans accepted, and had predicted a serious calamity. He also asserted Amasa Stone, builder, who committed suicide last week, was seeking to make as much as possible out of the construction of the bridge. Immediately afterwards Collins disappeared, and a few days later his dead body was found in his bath room under circumstances which indicated that he had committed suicide. Collins's friends and detectives who investigated the case declare that Collins was murdered. Collins was a native of Troy, N. Y., and was graduated at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in that city.

Some time ago Vereschajin received from the Czar Alexander III. an order for a picture. He at once set to work, and in due time forwarded to the Emperor one of his finest canvases, in which he had managed to paint nothing that could be construed as a piece of flattery. He called his picture "Our Prisoners." It showed a troop of Turkish prisoners of war, who were falling to the ground under the brutal blows of their escort, some robust Russian soldiers. The Czar was little pleased. He had expected flattery, and received—the naked truth. He nevertheless expressed the wish of making acquaintance of the painter. The day for the audience was fixed, and Vereschajin left Paris for St. Petersburg. When he appeared in the palace he was told that the Czar had now no time to see him, and that he must wait until he was called. As soon as he had received this answer, Vereschajin returned to Paris. On the following day a chamberlain of the Emperor called at the hotel where Vereschajin had been staying while in St. Petersburg, and asked for the artist. "He has left here," he was told. "What," exclaimed the horrified courier, "he is gone, and the Czar is waiting to-day to receive him! Did he leave no message?" "Oh, yes," the proprietor of the hotel replied, "he left word if anyone called for him, to say he had no time to wait."
