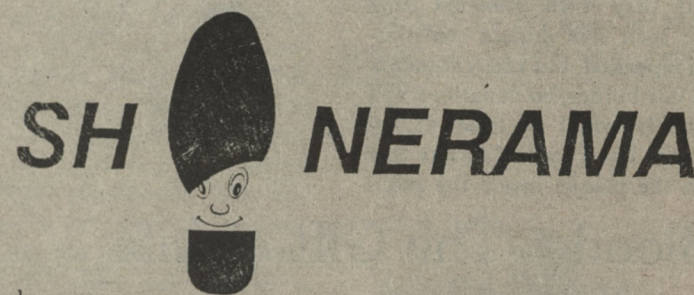
## Letter of Appreciation

## New Erection on Campus

Contractors are working on a large building next to the Barn. This "Field House" will be a facility for the 1991 Canada Winter Games, and will contain seating space for 1500 spectators. It promises to be a state-of-the-art fitness area as well, with space for a number of simultaneous sporting activities on three main courts.

The building will contain two squash courts, tow racquetball

courts, six locker rooms, a very modern weight room and training area, an upstairs running track, and offices for coaches and directors.

It is also a possibility that future exams and convocations will be held in this building.

Funding is provided by the federal, provincial, and municipal governments, as well as by UPEI. it is expected that the building will be ready by February, 1990.
