## Red Troop Concentrations Struck By U.S. Jet Bombers

SAIGON (AP) — B-52 jet bombers hit at three suspected Communist troop concentrations Thursday in a flurry of air strikes that coincided with disclosure that 334 soldiers fighting Viet Cong, guerrillas and North Vietnamese infiltrators died last week.

Of the 334, 195 were South Vietnamese and 136 United States troops. The U.S. toll was more than double the previous week, and U.S. battle deaths in Viet Nam since 1961 rose to 4,440.

## HIT NEAR BORDER

The eight-engine B-52 Starliner bombers from Guam staged one saturation raid just below the border in support of Operation Hastings, a sweep which U.S. Gen. William M. C. West, moribund, said appears to have demoralized North Viet Nam's 324B infantry division. Others hit jungle areas north of Saigon.

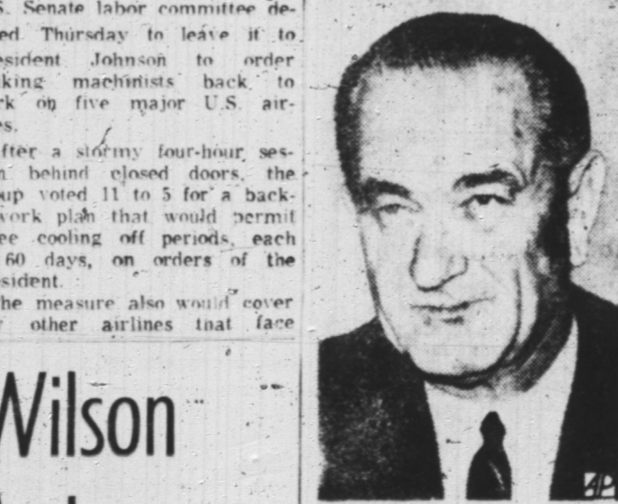
