CURRENCIES

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market made a moderate recovery Wednesday. Volume was 7,300,000 shares compared with 9,450,000 Tuesday. The Dow Jones industrial average rose 4.95 to 916.03.

AP AVERAGE UP

The Associated Press average of 50 stocks rose 1.7 to 340.9. Eleven of the 15 most active stocks advanced, two declined and two were unchanged.

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) - The Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges halted a downward trend Wednesday. Prices levelled in a fairly even mixture of gains and losses.

INDUSTRIAL VOLUME

Industrial volume was 369,600 shares, mines and oils 717,000 compared with 342,000 and 687,000 Tuesday.

INDUSTRIAL INDEX

The industrial index advanced 0.53 at 162.06. Utilities rallied, closing up 0.76 at 147.85. CPR jumped a point to 61% and Trans-Canada Pipe Line 1/4 to 83%.

PAPERS

Papers fell 0.35 at 121.96. Great Lakes eased 1/4 to 25% and Abitibi 1/4 to 12. Domtar and Price Bros. dipped 1/4 to 19% and 45%.

BANKS WERE OFF

Banks were off 0.23 at 120.84. Royal dropped 1/4 to 73% and Canadiane Nationale 1/2 to 65%.

SENIOR METALS

Senior metals moved higher. In the base section International Nickel jumped 1 1/2 points to 95% and Hudson Bay Mining one point to 81%.

SPECULATIVE MINES

Speculative mines and oils were off. Medicago continued to move lower as it dropped 50 cents to \$4.25 and Phoenix Canadian 10 cents to \$2.40.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - Prices were generally higher on the Toronto Stock Exchange Wednesday.

INDUSTRIALS

In industrials, Consolidated Bakeries climbed 2 1/2 to 7%, CPR 1 1/2 to 61%, Atlantic Star and Westcoast Transmission 3/4 to 27% and 25%.

B.C. TELEPHONE

B.C. Telephone dropped 1/4 to 71%, Interprovincial Pipe Line 1/4 to 82, Distillers Seagrams C to 36% and Bank of Nova Scotia 3/4 to 70%.

BANFF OIL

Banff Oil led the western oils higher, gaining 1 1/2 to 18% to 15,900 shares. Husky Oil and Canadian Superior added 3/4 to 12% and 21%, and Great Plains 1/4 to 12%.

AT MONTREAL

At Montreal, Hudson Bay Mining increased 1/4 to 80 3/4, Inco 3/4 to 44 and 57 1/2.

GOLDS DECLINED

Golds declined. Campbell Red Lake slid 1/2 to 20% and Kerr-Addison 1/4 to 10 1/2.

SPECULATIVES

Speculatives remained active with Coulee ahead 1/4 to 60 cents.

ON INDEX

On index, industrials were up 42 to 165.11, base metals 80 to 85.18, western oils 60 to 106.90 and the TSE 45 to 156.06.

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
