Moscow Woos Tokyo

Since the Second World War, Italy has had about two dozen governments. The latest resignation may have come as a shock to members of the Western Alliance who had hoped increasing strength in the Italian economy could lead to political stability.

Undoubtedly President Giuseppe Saragat will ask Moro to try to form a new government before he looks elsewhere for a political solution or decides on a general election. Moro's cabinet has been made up of 15 centre - of - the - road Christian Democrats, six Socialists, three Social Democrats and one Republican, a left-wing radical.
