Bible School at Murray River

For the first time in its history the Murray River Free Church of Scotland will sponsor a Vacation Bible School between the dates of August 1 and 10, excepting Saturday and Sunday. The Bible School will be open for all children ages 4 through 17. There will be four separate classes, Beginner, Primary, Junior and Intermediate. The classes will meet from 9 to 11:30 A.M. Monday through Friday with a 15 minute recess. The Beginners will be learning the subject "God's World and God's Word". The Primaries will take as their subject, "God's Family—How To Belong To It And Live In It". There will be colorful workbooks for every child and interesting take-home handwork. In connection with their subject, "The Christian's Time And Talents", the Juniors will be studying the history of timepieces down through the ages. In the Intermediate Department the subject will be "Answering Why's Of Young People." In these departments each child will also receive their own workbook. Closing exercises will be held the evening of August 10.

Mrs. Inman's Appointment Means Women Rep'd

Mrs. Florence Elsie Inman of Montague has been appointed the first lady Senator for the Province of Prince Edward Island. The announcement of Mrs. Inman's appointment was made last evening, an appointment which will mark a most momentous milestone, not only in the eventful life of Mrs. Inman, but also one in recognition of the struggle for complete women suffrage on Prince Edward Island, and women representation in legislative bodies.

Mrs. Inman has attained a high place in the public life of Prince Edward Island. In 1917, although not eligible to vote, she took part in urging women who did have a vote in the Federal election to use it. She was also one of the foremost in the struggle for women's suffrage, and in 1922 united with others to present a petition to the Legislative Assembly for women's suffrage, which went into effect in 1923.

In 1919 she became a charter member of the Women's Liberal Club, the second of its kind to be organized in Canada. Mrs. Inman is presently Provincial President of the Women's Liberal Club, and vice-president of the National Federation of Liberal Women.

Fourth generation Canadian, Florence Elsie MacDonald was born in West River, Queens County, daughter of the late Alexander MacDonald and Florence White MacDonald. The family moved to Charlottetown while she was yet a young girl, and several years later to Montague.

In 1910 she married barrister G. S. Inman, later Judge G. S. Inman of the County Court of Prince County. She accompanied him to Charlottetown and found time between home making and raising four sons, to engage in I.O.D.E. and Red Cross activities.

When her husband was appointed judge she accompanied him to Summerside. During the war years, with three sons overseas, one in each branch of the service, Mrs. Inman became especially active in Legion, Red Cross and Blood Donor work.

In 1946 she purchased the Poole Hotel at Montague where she has since resided and is presently vice-president of the Innkeepers Association. The only woman to

Wave Drowns 36 Swimmers In Japan

TSU, Japan (AP)—A great wave surged out of the treacherous Ise sea Thursday and drowned 36 of 47 Japanese high school girls who were taking a swimming test.

Witnesses said the girls were standing in placid waters, waist deep, about 35 feet out from the water's edge when the great breaker rolled in without warning, and carried the girls out to sea with its fearful undertow.

There was wild confusion. Approximately 200 fishermen, Japanese soldiers and other rescuers in boats brought all 47 to shore within a half hour. But police said there was delay in artificial respiration efforts and only 11 could be revived. It was Japan's worst swimming beach disaster.

The girls, aged 13 to 15, were among 385 students from a nearby junior high school who were on the final day of a week-long swim course. The swimming class had been assigned to a beach considered safe.

But after washing it at home he found the famous signature "Vincent" and other indications, such as the type of canvas used, which make it possible that the picture is genuine.

The scene of the picture is Saint-Remy where Van Gogh painted and it includes the typical cypress trees and corn fields of the Van Gogh style.

Colombo Plan Contracts Let OTTAWA (CP)—Contracts for Canada's share in a \$50,000,000 electric power and irrigation project in West Pakistan have been awarded to firms in Niagara Falls, Ont., and Montreal, the trade department announced on Thursday. The project, being built under the Colombo Plan with the Pakistani government sharing the cost, will take 3 1/2 years to complete. H. G. Acres and Company of Niagara Falls will design and supervise the project and the Angus Robertson Ltd., of Montreal, will provide construction experts and equipment.
