NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market declined moderately on average Tuesday. The averages were knocked down by a slump of 4 1/2 to 18 1/2 by du Pont. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials fell 4.23 to 844.82. The Associated Press 60-stock average declined 1.1 to 305.3. Standard and Poor's 500-stock index dipped 0.10 to 45.23. Of 1,372 issues traded, 561 advanced and 556 declined. Volume swelled to 6,279,000 shares from 4,900,000 Monday. Of the 15 most active stocks, 10 advanced, four declined and Midland Ross was unchanged. Sperry Rand, up 1 1/2 at 31 1/2 on 179,000 shares, topped the most active list. Ampex was up 1/2 at 26 1/2. Xerox slumped 7 1/2 to 22 1/2. Electronics were the strongest group, Raytheon gaining 1/4 at 43 1/2 and Zenith adding 1/4 at 68 1/2. U.S. Steel declined 1/2 to 41 1/2. Bethlehem lost 3/4 at 32 1/2 and Republic was off 1/2 at 38 1/2. Among Canadian issues, Walker-Gooderham and Alcan rose 3/4 and Hudson Bay Mining 1/2. Distillers-Seagrams and International Nickel fell 1/4. Prices were mixed on the American exchange. Volume rose to 1,720,000 shares from 1,410,000 Monday. Security-Rainbow Oil gained 1/4 and Jupiter Corp.'s Brazilian Light and Power fell 1/4. Canadian Javelin was unchanged. MONTREAL (CP)—Prices on the Montreal Stock Exchange Tuesday were irregularly mixed. Canadian Breweries on 23,175 shares closed 1/2 higher at 6 1/2. Dominion Glass on 9,200 shares finished 1/4 up at 15 1/2. Dominion Bridge added 1/4 at 20 1/2 and Alcan on 6,768 shares was 1/4 stronger at 33 1/2. Other 40-point winners were Distillers-Seagrams, Labatt and Salada Foods, at 30 1/2, 17 1/2 and 11 1/2 respectively. Canadian Marconi was 3/4 off 1/2, in sales of 2,650 shares. Molson B lost 1/4 on 6,221 shares, while the A issue remained unchanged at 17. CPR and Canadian Cement slipped 1/4 to 59 1/2 and 43 1/2 respectively. Bell Telephone stood unchanged at 50 1/2. 4,508 shares being traded. Interprovincial Pipe Line advanced 1/2 to 7 1/2 and Maritime Telephone 1/4 to 22 1/2. Quebec Natural Gas weakened 1/4 to 12 1/2. Among banks, Toronto-Dominion lost 1/2 to 59 and Royal 1/4 to 70. Montreal and Canadian Imperial Commerce were both unchanged at 56 and 60 1/2 respectively. MacMillan-Bloedel traded in a range between 25 and 26 1/2 and finished unchanged at 26 1/2. Consolidated slid 1/4 to 37 1/2 and Donmar 1/4 to 17 1/2 in the shaded papers section. Prices of Bns. backing the trend, added 1/4 to 14 1/2. Senior oils were irregularly lower. Home A stood 1/2-point down at 21 1/2. The B issue, after touching 22 1/2 and 22 1/2, was unchanged at 22 1/2. Pacific Petroleum hit a new low of 10 1/2, down 1/4, on a 3,929 shares. Industrial volume was 1,372,000 and mines and oil 1,037,300, compared with 91,300 and 1,478,100 Monday. On index, utilities were up 0.24 at 137.70; industrials unchanged at 156.74; banks off 0.43 at 114.09; and papers off 0.16 at 115.31. The composite index was unchanged at 149.33.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP)—Trading was dull on the Toronto Stock Exchange Tuesday. A total of 2,750,000 shares changed hands compared with 2,805,000 Monday. Interprovincial Pipe Line and Du Pont gained 1 each to 77 1/2 and 41 1/2 in the industrial list. Massey-Ferguson added 1/4 at 34 while Royal Bank slid 1/4 to 70 and Levy 1/4 to 18 1/4. Jaye Explorations jumped 1/2 to 47 cents on 25,900. A number of brokers say they don't know of any reason for the stock's recent popularity. In western oils Canadian Superior and Scurry Rainbow were up 1/4 to 21 1/2 and 32 1/2, respectively. Hudson's Bay rose 1/2 to 18 1/2 while Home A dipped 1/4 to 21 1/2. Among uranium Denison was off 1/2 to 62. Roman Corp. 1/4 to 14 1/2 and Rio Algom 1/4 to 26 1/2. On index, industrials were up .02 to 156.80, golds 1/2 to 128.22, western oils 46 to 106.01 and the TSE 0.10 to 149.96. Base metals dropped 25 to 96.87.

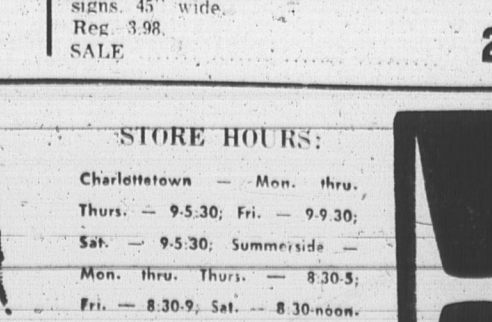
