Kensington Jaycees Install New Officers
 On Tuesday evening the Kensington Junior Chamber of Commerce held their annual meeting in the form of a supper meeting at Champion's Restaurant. Mr. Gerald MacKenzie was the chairman.
 The following slate of officers was installed for the coming year:
 President, Edward MacCounigan; first vice president, Gordon Cooke; second vice president, James A. Ramsay; secretary, Eric Jessome; treasurer, Arthur Avery; executive, Arthur Ready, Dr. James Higgins, Ronald Kennedy, W. S. MacLean and George Howatt.
 Mr. Arthur Avery was initiated in an impressive ceremony by Mr. T. J. Ling.
 Mr. Archie Johnstone was nominated as a regional president to the Maritime conference of the Jaycees to be held in Saint John in May. Mr. Gordon Cooke was elected chairman of the Blood Donors Clinic to be held in Kensington on June 10th.
 The members decided to request the town to sweep and clean the front streets and to spray calcium chloride on the gravelled streets of the town.
 Considerable discussion took place regarding the disbanding of the organization and the forming of a board of trade in the town. Mr. Gordon Cooke and Mr. Eric Jessome are to investigate the possibilities of forming a branch of this organization.
 Past president Gerald MacKenzie read the annual report of the branch and the financial report as read was favorably received by the 15 members present.

Contracts For S'ide Firms
 OTTAWA, April 29—(Special)—Prince Edward Island, which usually doesn't figure in defence production department contracts, appeared in the departmental contract list from April 1 to 15 today for the first time in several months. Two Summerside firms were awarded defence contracts in this period. One was to Joseph Read and Company, Limited, for \$63,650 for coal. The second was to Summerside's White Star Laundry Limited and amounted to \$16,500 for laundry services.

Lobster Fishermen Ready For Season
 —Although the North Shore lobster season does not open officially until May 1st, it is permissible to run lines today and fishermen in West Prince are all set to set sail for the fishing grounds at twelve noon. Thousands of traps are piled high on the wharves and at the harbours in readiness for the opening day. The bait situation was described as good in all localities with no shortage anticipated. Unlike last year when drift ice delayed trap setting for several days, no difficulty is expected from that quarter. As far as was known last evening the new carapace measurement for lobsters was to be enforced which particularly affects fishermen in the Western Prince area where a smaller run of lobsters is caught than in other sections of the province.
 Among those launching new boats at Alberton South this year are Merle Matthews with a new thirty-five foot boat powered with an eight cylinder Marine engine; Kenneth Hutt, also a thirty-five foot vessel powered with a 120 h.p. 6-cylinder Marine engine. Herbert Fraser and Herbert Avery also are starting the season with new and larger boats.
