GOMES SENTENCED

OPORTO, Portugal (AP)—Prof. Ruy Luis Gomes, a candidate for the Portuguese presidency in 1951, has been sentenced to 18 months in prison on charges of "subversive propaganda and attempt against the security of the state." The Supreme Court disqualified him for the presidency in 1951, and government spokesmen accused him of being pro-Communist.

Cub Leaders Take Course

The course will conclude on Thursday of next week.

The training given will include all aspects of the Wolf Cub programme and is the second of three parts leading to the Gilwell neckerchief and heads. Mr. W. A. Speed, Executive Commissioner of Nova Scotia is the course leader.

Following is a description of the pictures, with the approximate size in each case:

1. Elizabeth Douglas, daughter of Capt. Douglas, R. N., (family of Duke of Hamilton), born 22nd April, 1700; married 1722 to Edward Smith, Capt. R.N., died January 1777. Grandmother of Admiral Sir Sidney Smith and of Governor Charles Douglas Smith. Portrait approximately 4ft. x 3ft 4in.

2. Mary Wilkinson, sister of Lady Campbell, married to John Spencer Smith, 1760, gentleman usher to Queen Charlotte. Mother of Admiral Sir Sidney Smith and of Governor Charles Douglas Smith. Portrait 2ft. 6in x 2ft.

3. Capt. Edward Smith, R.N., born 1691 or 1692, married 1722 to Elizabeth Douglas, died 21st June, 1743, of his wounds. Buried in St. John's Churchyard, Antigua, British West Indies. Grandfather of Admiral Sir Sidney Smith and of Governor Charles Douglas Smith. Portrait 4ft. 1in. x 3ft. 4in.

4. John Spenser Smith, Captain in the Guards, gentleman usher to Queen Charlotte, aide-de-camp to Lord George Sackville Germain; born 8th June, 1730; married 1760 to Mary Wilkinson, died 16th February, 1804. Father of Admiral Sir Sidney Smith and of Charles Douglas Smith, Governor of Prince Edward Island. Portrait 2ft. 6in x 2ft. 1in.

The pictures shown above are of four magnificent oil paintings, received as a gift by the P. E. Island Historical Society from Mr. Cecil H. de V. Harvest, of Ste. Genevieve-de-Pierrefonds, Quebec, a descendant of the Hon. Charles Douglas Smith who was Lieutenant Governor of Prince Edward Island from 1813 to 1824. The portraits are of Governor Smith's parents and grandparents and are now on display at the Historical Society's exhibition in the Y. M. C. A. building.

Officials of the Society are deeply appreciative of the generosity of Mr. Harvest, who had the paintings forwarded at his own expense from an art gallery in London, England. The Society has received assurance from Premier Matheson that when the pictures are not on display adequate storage facilities will be provided in the vault in the Provincial Building.

City Councillor Edwin C. Johnson represented Mayor Stewart in his unavoidable absence. Hon. B. Earle MacDonald, Provincial Secretary Treasurer and a former C.N.R. employee who still retains his classification brotherhood membership, was also present and spoke briefly. Acting Superintendent G. 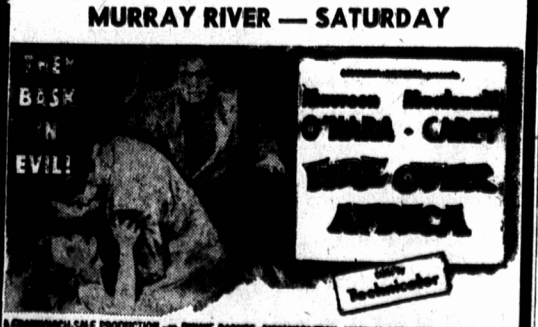
