There are about five hundred scholars registered, and a daily average attendance of about three hundred and fifty, divided among nine teachers. The examinations were very satisfactory, and the entertainment was excellent. This school, also, is a credit to the town. The unusually good singing was one of the most pleasing features of the entertainment. Harry Anderson's solo, "The Better Land," was capital. Anderson possesses in a large measure the gift of song, and is evidently being well instructed in music. The dumb bell exercises are worthy of special note, as showing that the physical as well as the mental education of the pupils of West Kent Street School are being attended to in a practical way.
