NEW YORK (AP)—A scattering of investment demand late in the session rescued the stock market from an irregular decline Friday and resulted in highs for the popular averages.

Volume was 7,670,000 shares compared with 7,890,000 Thursday.
By early afternoon the list appeared to be heading into decline. The Dow Jones average was off as much as 1.72 but gradually cut its losses and ended with a rise of .67 at 968.13.

Standard and Poor's index rose .06 to a record 93.14.
General Motors rose 3/4, Zenith 3, International Paper 3/4, Crown Zellerbach 3/4 and Anacosta 3/4.

International Nickel, a big gainer this week, fell 3/4.
McIntyre Porcupine was up more than 2 points, and Dome Mines gained 3/4. Walker Gooderham was ahead 3/4, and Aluminium 1/2.

Prices were irregularly higher on the American Stock Exchange, where Massey-Ferguson lost 1/4 in active trading, Jupiter Corp was off 1/4 but Canadian Javelin and Scurry Rainbow Oil gained 1/4.

MONTREAL
MONTREAL (CP)—Stocks continued upward for the eighth straight session Friday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.

Base metals were off but most other sections moved higher.
Trading was heavy. Midexesa reached a high jumping 45 cents to \$4.25 on 19,000 shares in speculative mines. Matabewan Canadian rose 26 cents to \$1.30.

Kodiak climbed 15 cents to \$3.25 and Patricia Silver 10 cents to \$1.50.
Industrial volume was 235,000 shares, mines and oil 2,175,400 compared with 161,000 and 1,610,000 Thursday.

The composite index rose 0.88 at 162.12. Industrials were up 0.90 at 167.90.
Banks rose 0.77 at 128.15. Imperial Commerce led up one point to 67 3/4.

Utilities were up 0.67 at 157.18.
CPR and Trans-Canada Pipe Line rose 1/4 to 67 and 39 1/4. Bell and Maritime Telephone climbed 1/4 to 60 1/4 and 22 1/4.

Papers moved higher 0.66 to 122.42. Fraser advanced one point to 32 and Grand Lakes 3/4 to 23 1/4.

Domtar and MacMillan Bloedel climbed 1/4 to 19 1/4 and 27 1/4.
Senior oils were higher. Texaco jumped 3/4 to 55 1/4, Shell 1/2 to 20 1/4.

Fleetwood led machinery, advancing 1/4 to a high of 27.
In the metal section primary issues were higher, Dominion Bridge and Steel of Canada rising 1/4 to 28 1/4 and 29 1/4. The base section was off with Inter-National Nickel slipping 3/4 to 100 1/4 and Hollinger 1/4 to 26 1/4.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP)—Industrials showed strength as the index advanced 61 to 173.24, the highest since June 1, when it was 174.02, on the Toronto Stock Exchange Friday.

In industrials Du Pont was ahead 2 1/2 to 45 1/4, Atlantic Sugar added 1 1/4 to 26 1/4 and Dominion Bridge gained 3/4 to 28 1/4.

Banks made good advances as Royal and Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce moved ahead 1 to 76 1/4 and 67 1/4, Nova Scotia and Montreal were up 3/4 to 76 and 64 1/4.

Among base metals Inco was off 3/4 to 100 1/4 while Campbell Chibougamau lost 30 cents to 7.80 and Normetal 25 cents to 4.70.

Kerr Goldmine climbed 20 cents to 9.60 in gold issues and Bralorne 10 cents to 4.05.
On the speculative side D'Elondia jumped 21 cents to 1.25 on more than 1,035,000 shares.

On index, industrials were up .61 to 173.24, golds .67 to 163.17, Western oils .56 to 104.05 and the TSE .54 to 163.08. Base metals were off .29 to 8.32. Volume was 3,865,000 shares compared with 3,265,000.

Stock prices were about two hours higher as a result of computer trouble.
