Stars Edge Dodgers 3-1 To End Losing Streak

Tom MacFarlane's Stars finally came through with a win after an extended losing streak of six games last night as they eked out a 3-1 victory over the Dodgers in a close, exciting battle at Memorial Field.

Vern Handrahan and lefty Art MacLeod hooked up in a tight pitchers' duel each giving up only five hits but MacLeod's wildness was his undoing as he issued nine free passes to first and hit one batter.

Handrahan gave up only two walks, hit two batters and sent 12 batters down swinging, which is a high for the current season.

Both the Dodgers and Stars scored all of the runs in the fifth frame. In the top half MacGuigan got the first hit of the game off MacLeod. Purcell drew his first of three walks and "LeClair sacrificed them around one base. Dunn then hit a ground ball and the throw to the plate was into the dirt allowing both runners to score. Dunn advanced to second on the play and crossed the plate on Coyle's single.

"Donuts" MacDonald led off the last half with a walk, stole second and tried to go all the way on Ken MacDonald's single to left, but a perfect throw by Dave MacLeod cut him down at the plate. Brian McCallum followed with a double that scored Mac-

Donald with the only Dodger run. Forbie Kennedy, slammed out another double for the losers while Jay and Squarebriggs picked up singles.

Willie Dunn and Joe Coyle paced the Stars, each getting two singles in four trips. Lorne McGuigan clipped a single.

CLEVELAND, (AP)—Given six-hit pitching by lefty Dean Stone, the Washington Nationals whacked four Cleveland hurlers for a dozen base hits Tuesday night to thump the Tribe 8-1. The victory was the fourth straight for the Nats and evened their season record with the Indians at six games apiece.

In a five-run fourth inning the Nats chased Bob Lemon from the mound with his seventh loss against 12 victories.

All five runs were unearned because Ralph Kiner dropped Clint Courtney's short fly after two were out. At this stage the score favored Washington 7-0.

Stone, winning his fifth against 10 losses, yielded his only run in the fifth inning. He walked Bob Avila and Kiner with two out, and Al Rosen singled Avila home.

NEW YORK (AP)—Young Wilard Schmidt tossed a four-hitter to beat New York's Giants 3-1 in the first game of a two-night doubleheader Tuesday night and John Windy McCall came back to check the St. Louis Cardinals on four hits in the nightcap for a 4-2 New York victory.

The Cardinals, a 26-year-old righthander making his third try to stick with the Cards, got his support from home runs by rookies Bill Virdon and Ken Boyer in the opener.

Two runs in the third inning of the second game, one unearned, brought McCall his fourth victory in seven decisions. In and out of the majors since 1948, the 30-year-old southpaw, gave up his hits in pairs—in the fourth and sixth— to give the Giants a split in the first two-nighter staged in the Polo grounds in two years.

Commission Can Ban Fight

NEW YORK (AP)—The state Supreme Court Monday upheld the right of the state athletic commission to bar a fight in which the manager of one of the boxers has been suspended.

Justice Martin E. Frank made the ruling in the case of Chris Christensen, Danish welterweight, who had been scheduled to meet Gene Poirer of Niagara Falls, N. Y., at St. Nicholas Arena next Monday night.

Christensen sought to compel the commission to lift its ban imposed after Christensen's manager, Charles Bauer, had been set down by the New York athletic commission.

Bauer was suspended, along with a group of other managers, for failure to testify at a commission hearing into activities of the manager's guild.

LIVERPOOL, N.S. (CP)—Liverpool Larupers received stout three-hit pitching from little Don MacLeod as they thumped Dartmouth Arrows 8-0 in a Halifax and District Senior Baseball game called after seven innings because of darkness.

Castoff Anxious To Make Team With Tiger-Cats

HAMILTON, (CP)—The fellow who wants most to make the Hamilton Tiger-Cats football team is a castoff. Coach Carl Voyles thinks he's the best passer in the Big Four union.

The player is Nobby Wirkowski, a 28-year-old quarterback who for four years stood behind a weak line, got smeared and endured the boots and howls of fans who thought he was a bum.

Wirkowski, cut loose from Toronto Argonauts last winter, is one of 61 players in pre-season training with Ticats. He wants the Hamilton quarterbacking job more than anything else.

"You can be sure I'll do everything I can to make the team," Nobby said in an interview. "I think they will have a fine club this year."

Wirkowski holds no apparent grudge against Argos, although they chopped him from the squad along with all the other imports in a sweeping rebuilding manoeuvre. He won't even say that one of his greatest kicks would be to return to Varsity Stadium as a Tiger-Cat and kick the bejabbers out of Argonauts.

To such questions, Nobby merely replied: "I'd like to beat every team in the league. However, beating Argos would be something a little extra."

Although Voyles rates Nobby as "the best passer in the league," he has said at least two United States quarterbacks to give Wirkowski a run.

Voyles has high-class pivot candidates in Don Bailey, former star with Penn state college, and Don Watson, from Austin college. There may be others before Voyles has to declare his 10 imports after the third game of the schedule, which starts Sept. 3.
