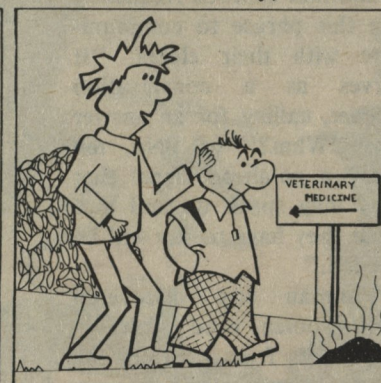
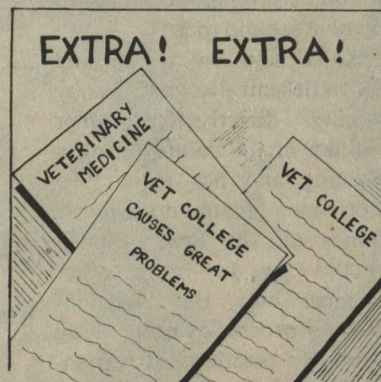
Pillsbury Canada Undergraduate Scholarship Program

Equality — A Prerequisite for Peace

The emancipation of women, the achievement of full equality between the sexes is one of the most important, though less acknowledged prerequisites for peace.

In the world of humanity we see a great difference; the female sex is treated as though inferior, and is not allowed equal rights and privileges. The denial of such inequality perpetrates an injustice against one half of the world's population, and promotes in men harmful attitudes and habits which are carried from the family to the work place, to political life, and ultimately to international relations. There are no grounds, moral, practical or biological, upon which such denial can be justified.

Humanity is like a bird with its two wings — the one is male, the other female. Unless both wings are strong and impelled by some common force, the bird cannot fly heavenwards. According to the spirit of this age, women must advance and fulfill their mission in all departments of life, becoming equal to all men. They must be on the same level as men and enjoy equal rights.

Equality of the status of men and women does not

imply equality of function, in which they clearly differ. Some jobs are best done by men, some by women, and some equally well by either.

What matters that neither men nor women should deem the other sex inferior because of its different function.

Woman's lack of progress

and proficiency has been due to her lack of equal education and opportunity. Had she been allowed this equality there is no doubt she would be

the counterpart of man in ability and capability.
