Former Sailor Forming CS In Northwest Territories

OTTAWA (CP)—Creation of a separate Northwest Territories civil service has been begun here.

This is one of the assignments for R. C. (Bert) Sivertz, who was named Jan. 13 as the first large-time commissioner for the future bulk of Canadian real estate north of the 60th parallel and east of the Yukon.

Mr. Sivertz, 58, a Victoria-born former merchant seaman and wartime sailor, joined the northern affairs department in 1950. For a while in 1963, he continued the long-standing practice of being both Northwest Territories commissioner and a northern affairs department head.

Now, he has just the one job and it's a big one — starting from the task of finding new office space and a new staff. At least some of these may be federal employees who elect to go north to live — or who already are there with the northern affairs or other departments.

HANDLED EVERYTHING
Mr. Sivertz had been director of the northern administration branch responsible for education, welfare and virtually all other aspects of Northwest Territories administration.

By contrast, the Yukon, which the Northwest Territories intend to copy, has an administration operated from Whitehorse although the federal government of course continues to put up most of the operating funds.

Farm Price Index Up In P.E.I., Down In Other Provs.

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada's index of farm prices of agricultural products declined 3 per cent in December to 244.6 compared with the revised November index of 253.3; the bureau of statistics said today.

This latest decline in the index — based on 1953-59 equalizing trend — continues a downward trend that started last July. Between November and December, lower prices were recorded for livestock and eggs while potato prices were higher.
