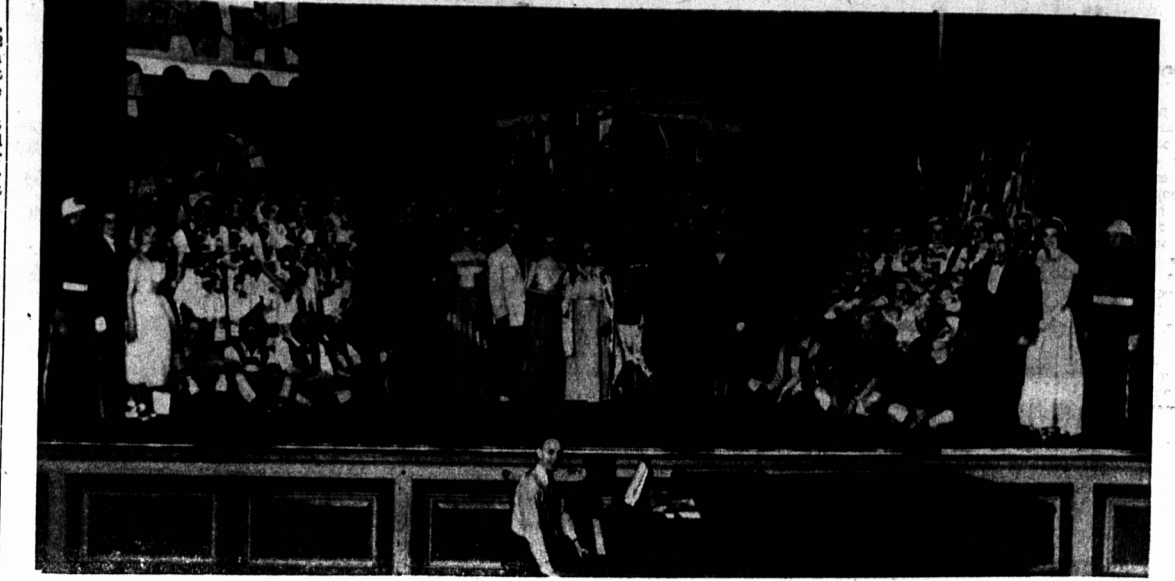

LONDON (Reuters)—The 15,316-ton liner Akaron has made her last voyage on the Australia-New Zealand run which she has plied for 40 years.

The ship, which served as a troop transport in the First World War, probably will be sold for scrap, the Shaw Savill Line said.

MOVE HEADQUARTERS VIENNA (Reuters)—The Communist World Peace Council announced Sunday that it plans to move its headquarters from Prague, Czechoslovakia, to Vienna.

To Resume Ferry Schedule May 1

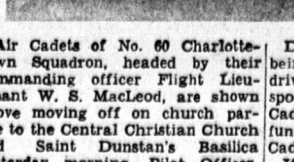
