Birdie isn't liked yet. He knows his baseball and he will have those Braves in contention before too long. But the upward better come soon. The deficit might be too big to erase.

Koufax Sets 'Day' Record; Fans 18 Chicago Batters

CHICAGO (AP)—"I was just trying to get those Cubs out of there at the end—I didn't know I was breaking any record."

This was Sandy Koufax of Los Angeles Dodgers talking after his 18 strikeouts in a 10-2

Dodger triumph over the Chicago Cubs set a National League daytime mark.
"It wasn't like when I first matched Bob Feller's record by striking out 18 against San Francisco (Aug. 31, 1959)," said Koufax, with a grin.

"Then, there were some 32,000 fans in the Los Angeles Coliseum and I knew right along I was shooting at the record." Although the 18 strikeouts set a National League mark for day games, it just tied the major league record for strikeouts in day or night games.

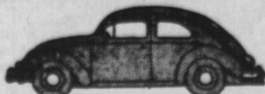

Los Angeles Blasts Cubs; Pale Hose Upset Yankees

Southpaw Sandy Koufax, Los Angeles Dodgers fast ball artist, struck out 18 batters while the Dodgers were waiting to a 10-2 win over Chicago Cubs Tuesday, and equalled the modern major league strikeout record, held jointly by himself and hall of famer Bob Feller.

Koufax, with 15 set down on strikes as he entered the last inning, calmly struck out the side to tie the record. His previous record-tying effort came Aug. 31, 1959 but he lost the game to San Francisco Giants. Feller set the strikeout record Oct. 2 1938 pitching for Cleveland Indians against Detroit Tigers.

Koufax gave up only six hits to Chicago Tuesday while the Dodgers defeated losing pitcher Don Cardwell with power hitting.

Dog Helps In Victory

TORONTO (CP)—The Stanley Cup is usually won by hockey players, but this year's winners—Toronto Maple Leafs—had an assist from a boxer.

Stafford Smythe, president of the Leafs, told the story.

As he spoke, he patted the boxer on the head. Duke is not a ring type boxer—Duke is a dog.

"Duke was one of the conditions in the trade we made for Bert Olmstead and you'd have say that Olmstead certainly helped us win."

"When we tried to deal for Olmstead with Montreal Canadiens, Frank Selke said he'd make the deal only if I bought his boxer puppy from him."

"So, to get Olmstead I had to take the dog, too."

"It's been a good deal all around."

Tommy Davis slammed a three-run homer in the fifth, Duke Snider hit a two-run blast in the ninth and Andy Carey pitched in with a solo homer in the fifth.

YANKS LOSE AGAIN
In American League day-game action, New York Yankees dropped their third straight game as Floyd Robinson hit a two-run homer in the eighth to give Chicago White Sox a 3-1 victory.

Losing pitcher Ralph Terry appeared on his way to an easy win with a 1-0 lead provided by Johnny Blanchard's third homer of the campaign. But after one run had scored in the eighth for Chicago, Robinson spoiled the day, also boosting his league-leading average to .469.

Roger Maris, again, went hitless and his average dropped to .122.

Boston Red Sox knocked off Washington Senators 4-1 as Boston's Pete Runnels hit two homers, almost equalling his 1961 total of three.

Runnels, the 1960 American League batting champion, homered in the third to give Boston a 1-0 lead and then again in the eighth to break a 1-1 tie.

Galen Cisco gave up four hits and took the win. Joe McClain suffered the loss.
