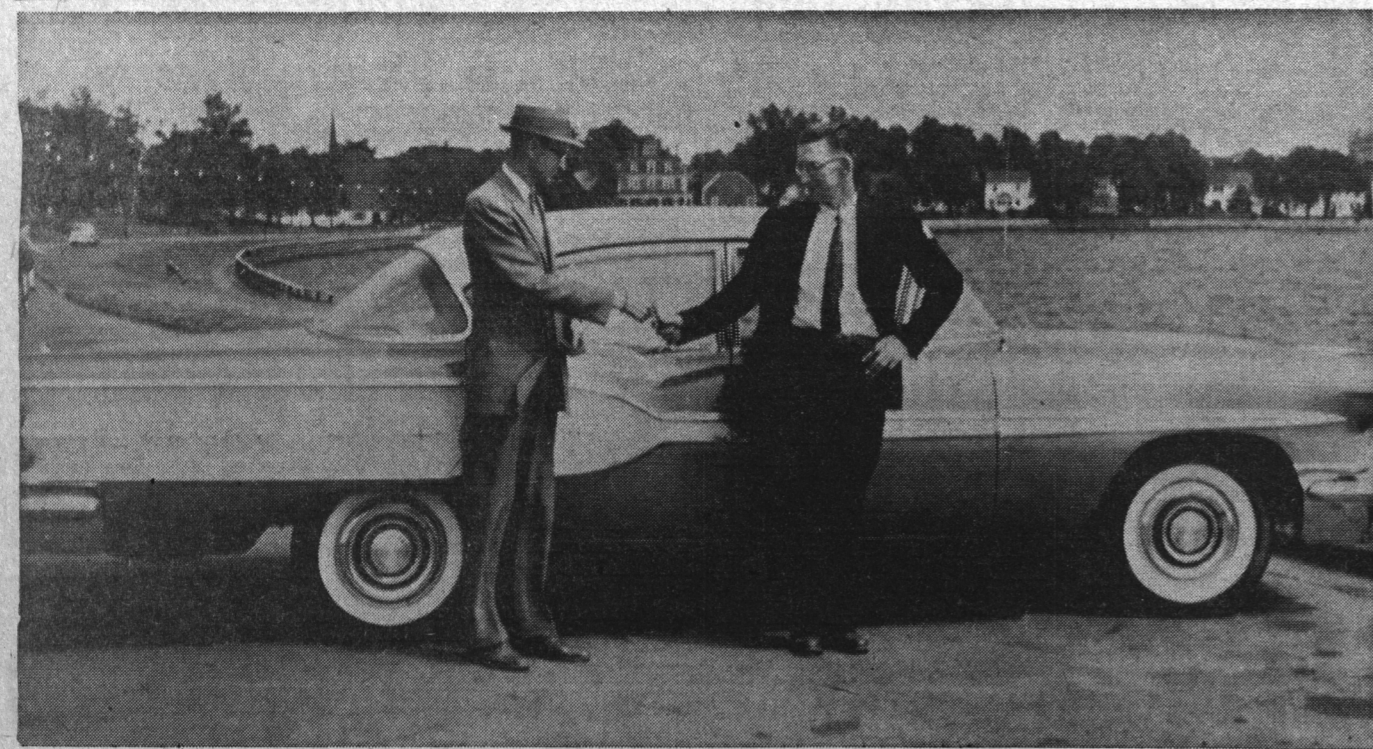
Pearson Urges Stopping Atom Bomb Testing

OTTAWA (CP) — Opposition leader Pearson said Thursday atomic bomb tests should be stopped for a period even though no international agreement is reached to ban test explosions.

He made the statement in the Commons after Health Minister Monteith reported on Canada's role in the work of the United Nations scientific committee on the effects of atomic radiation. The report stated that any rise in the world level of radiation constituted a potential danger to health.

Efforts were being made at Geneva to reach international agreement on a ban. However, even if such an agreement were not reached, consideration should

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. JOSEPH MALONE
It was with deep shock and regret that the many friends of Mary Malone, beloved wife of Joseph Malone, learned of her passing in the Charlottetown Hospital on April 30th, at the early age of 54 years.

Though not in good health for some time, the seriousness of her condition was not realized until she was admitted to hospital on March 31st. She underwent surgery on April 5th, and for a time seemed to be making progress, but then, in spite of excellent medical attention and constant, loving care, she slipped quietly away on April 30th.

Mary was born in Charlottetown, the elder daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Fred Powers, and received her education at Notre Dame Academy, although seriously crippled by polio at the age of four. On April 22, 1925, she married Joseph Malone, and the couple resided in Charlottetown during their marriage. Although her disability restricted her outside activities, her home was always open to friends and neighbours and anyone in need, and her kindness and generosity well known to everyone with whom she came in contact.

Left behind to mourn their deep loss are her husband, Joseph, a daughter, Helen, Mrs. Russell Stanley of Brandon, Manitoba, and a son, Ted, of Halifax, N.S., all of whom were constantly at her bedside during her illness in hospital. Also three grandchildren Teddy, Elaine and Gerry Stanley, and a sister, Helen, Mrs. Edward L. Trainor, South Boston, Mass.

The remains rested at the Hennessey Funeral home, where many friends called to pay their last respects. The funeral, which was largely attended, was held to the Church of the Most Holy Redeemer, where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Very Rev. Moreau, C. Ss R. Interment took place in the Catholic Cemetery, with Rev. C. Coghlin, C. Ss R., conducting the service at the grave. Pallbearers were J. Davey, C. Corrigan, W. Cullen, P. Clarkin, W. A. Davey, R. Air Clashes Over Strait Of Formosa

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Nationalist jet planes clashed with speedy MIG-17s in two air skirmishes with Chinese Reds Thursday over the Formosa Strait.

In one fight the Nationalists shot down two jets, possibly three, the defence ministry reported.

At sea, nationalist gunboats sank one of seven Communist boats apparently seeking to rescue a downed Red pilot.

Radio Peiping, meanwhile, said two Nationalist Thunderjets were shot down and another damaged by Red Chinese planes near the coast of Fukien province on the Chinese mainland.

Nationalist Defence Minister Yu Ta-wei said Communist China has massed forces along a 750-mile stretch of coast and is ready to probe any weak point in the Formosa defences.

Reports Fire Main Cause Of Eskimo Deaths

OTTAWA (CP)—Northern Affairs Minister Hamilton said Thursday night a fire which destroyed a food cache 10 miles from Garry Lake was the main contributing factor to the deaths by starvation of 16 Eskimos last February and March.

"I don't believe the tragedy can be blamed on anyone," he said in the Commons after reading a lengthy report by a northern service officer on the circumstances surrounding the deaths.

Earlier reports said 14 Eskimos died of starvation and exposure, but Mr. Hamilton said 16 died, directly or indirectly as a result of the fire which destroyed the food cache.

Earlier, too, he said, no one in Ottawa knew what amount of food was in the cache.

But at the night sitting of the Commons, Mr. Hamilton said that Spartan Airways of Ottawa, which had done some work in the area west of Hudson Bay, had donated 2,400 pounds of food to the Garry Lake Eskimos, to be kept at the cache.

Additional food supplies were flown in in December and April by the RCMP. Mr. Hamilton said, adding that the cache was two-thirds full, providing for a safety margin, when it burned down.

The fire was due to the explosion of an oil burner, the report read by Mr. Hamilton said.
