ALL FROM ONTARIO

Three Shooters Qualify For Olympic Rifle Team

SOUTH MARCH, Ont. (CP)—Three Ontario small-bore riflemen qualified Wednesday at the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association prize shoot to represent Canada at the Olympics in Melbourne, Australia.

Gerry Ouellette of Windsor, Ont. and Gilmour Boa of Toronto finished first and second respectively in the small-bore rifle trials, while Cpl. Jim Zavitz of RCMP Ottawa, chalked up the top score in the pistol trials to beat out two other competitors.

Ouellette, who celebrated his 22nd birthday Tuesday and represented Canada at Bisleigh this year, finished one point ahead of the Toronto small-bore and service rifle expert. The two were tied at

the end of the second day of trials. Boa has been on the Bisleigh team three times and qualified on seven other occasions.

Ouellette finished the three-day trials with 1,793-123x of a possible 1,800-180x in a prone position. In the pistol trials, Zavitz scored an aggregate of 1,576 of a possible 1,600 for a 20-point margin over Toronto detective Ed Barkley.

EXTRA MAN ON TEAM

The Canadian team was originally to consist of two trapshooters, a small-bore rifle expert and a pistol shot. However, the Canadian Civilian Association of Marksmen, which sponsored the trials in conjunction with the DCRA, received approval from the Canadian Olympic Association to name a second rifleman.

A 12-man Ontario team was

awarded the provincial bankers' team prize with a combined score of 1,130 of a possible 1,200. The team match is fired concurrently with the bankers' individual match. Ontario beat out a team from Nova Scotia which finished second with 1,123 and a Manitoba team which placed third with 1,117.

Because of a statistical error, the Nova Scotia team was counted winner of the team match in results earlier Wednesday.

WIN STEINHARDT TROPHY

A six-man Nova Scotia team chalked up the highest combined score to win the Steinhardt Trophy fired concurrently with the Tyro match, with a score of 286 of a possible 300. In runner-up position was a team from Alberta with 283.

Members of the Nova Scotia team and their individual scores: J. B. Baker 48; Capt. W. A. Goss 48; E. J. McKay 48; A. L. Fraser 48; Pte. R. R. McKay 46; and Cpl. G. Harper 46.

George Hanson, a member of Ottawa's National Defence Headquarters Rifle Association, bested some 700 other marksmen blasting 24 consecutive bullseyes into the target before dropping to an inner four for a score of 124 of a possible 125.

Two Victoria marksmen, Sgt. F. Drysdale and Maj. A. M. T. Spittal, finished in second place with 122. Five men tied for third place with 121s including Sgt. M. P. Seck of Greenwood, N.S.

A four-man team from the 1st RCAF Air Division in France, captured the MacDonald Brier Shield for posting the highest combined score in the MacDonald match. They scored 470 of a possible 500.

EDMUNDSTON, N.B. (CP)—The field was cut to 16 Wednesday but most of the favorites succeeded fully, played out the first two rounds of the Canadian amateur golf championship here.

Surviving the first day's play were Canadian Open champion Doug Sanders of Miami Beach, Fla., 1955 amateur king, Moo Noyes of Kitchener, Ont., newly-crowned Canadian junior champion Gary Cowan, of Norman's home club in Kitchener, seven other Canadians and six of Sanders' local countrymen.

Sanders goes against Frank Strafaci of Garden City, N.Y., in today's fourth round. Norman Langley, with Ed Melstner of Willoughby, Ohio, and Cowan matches strokes with the 1955 junior champion, George Knudson of Winnipeg.

DOWN'S MARTINISERS

Sanders, winner of the world's amateur championship at Chicago last year, defeated Peter Hope of Dartmouth, N.S., 4 and 2 in the first round, then set down Ralph Harley of Moncton, N.B., 4 and 3 in the afternoon.
