The Morell hall was filled to capacity on Monday night by farmers who came to get first hand information on the handling of this year's potato crop.

New Wine And Old Bottles
The Morell meeting brought out the fact that the regulation stipulating that island potatoes must be shipped in clean new sacks is causing some difficulty for growers who have been in the habit of using new sacks for digging purposes and later on for shipping.

In Or Out
With respect to pool marketing a question which frequently arises is the one as to when the farmer must declare his intention and whether he can be in or out as he chooses.

Cheap Education
Of 60 students enrolled in the Nova Scotia Agricultural College, only two are from P. E. I. and in spite of the fact that a variety of scholarships and assistance are offered which cut the cost of obtaining very excellent courses to bare minimum.

Capital Investment
In 1901 the average capital investment per Canadian farm was \$3497.00 made up of \$2746.00 for land buildings, \$213.00 for machinery, and \$538.00 for livestock. By 1951 the total had gone up to \$13,505.00 made up of \$7,770.00 for real estate, \$2856.00 for machinery, and \$2989.00 for livestock.

Cattle Auctions
Good feeder cattle, steers and heifers going through three large auctions in Ontario brought from 17 to 18 cents. In all 5,991 cattle of all kinds were sold for a total of \$687,000.00 such auction sales are operated by groups of farmers and serve as an efficient method of getting the best market price with a minimum of haggling.
