THE COOK'S CORNER

Lamb Moulded in Mint Jelly 1-2 tablespoons gelatine 1-4 cup cold water 1-2 cups boiling water 1-4 cup vinegar 3 cups cold diced lamb 1-4 cup sugar 1 teaspoon salt 3-4 cup chopped mint leaves 1-4 cup diced sweet red or green pepper

Soak gelatine in cold water. Combine water, sugar, vinegar, and mint leaves. Boil 3 minutes. Cover saucepan. Strain out leaves. Reheat to boiling point. Add gelatine. Allow to partially set in one large or six individual moulds. Serve on crisp lettuce. Garnish with fresh vegetables.

This jelly is more attractive if green colouring is added to mixture before jelly sets.

French Peach Crumbly Cust 1 lb green beans 8 small young carrots 1-4 teaspoons salt 3 tablespoons butter 3 Method: String the beans and then cut them lengthwise into narrow strips. This takes a little longer than breaking them crosswise, but they look so attractive. Wash and scrape the carrots and cut them lengthwise also into matchlike strips.

Put both of the vegetables into a heavy saucepan and add just enough water to come up in the pan 1 inch. Cover closely and cook for 15 minutes. Add the salt and the butter and cook covered for 20 minutes longer or until the vegetables are tender. Uncover the last few minutes to allow any liquid to cook away. This is a good combination and such a colorful one.

The pineapple cucumber salad can be made just from the fresh fruit and vegetable, or you can mould it in gelatin. That is a recipe which we have given often. If you plan to serve it without the gelatin, this is an attractive way to arrange the ingredients.

LONDON, July 24.—When Princess Margaret was born no new cot was purchased for her. Instead she was placed in the simple bassinet cot with white-painted iron frame which was used by Princess Elizabeth.

Q. How can I clean brass articles effectively?
A. Mix one gallon of paraffin oil, 1-2-gill of kerosene, and sufficient powdered tripol to make a paste. Rub with this mixture, wipe off, and polish with a dry soft cloth.
