

Smallwood Lists Two Big Jobs Facing His Gov't

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Premier Joseph Smallwood, whose office Tuesday was a back to back majority, Wednesday listed a third pulp mill and revision of terms of union with Canada as the two big jobs ahead.

The third mill, long advocated in political circles here, was expected to be a major point before the election campaign opened, and Wednesday Mr. Smallwood said discussions on a mill "have progressed so satisfactorily that it may become necessary" to call a fall session of the legislature.

The revision of the financial terms of union with Canada will come before a royal commission early next year and the Newfoundland commission appointed to prepare the province's case is expected to complete its report shortly. Under terms of union a commission will study terms seven years after Confederation.

CABINET CHANGES
Premier Smallwood, who said he was not surprised when his party took 32 of the 36 seats in the legislature, said there were "many" things his new government would have to take up, but he mentioned only the two subjects. He indicated there would be several cabinet changes, but he declined to elaborate.

The 56-year-old Liberal leader reiterated his earlier statements that he had no immediate plans for retirement. He said he would continue to lead the government "until I think there is someone more suitable for the job." He said there were at least four potential premiers now in the government.

A royal commission on forestry recommended last year that a third pulp mill could operate successfully in the province, and Mr. Smallwood says large companies in Italy, the United States and the Canadian mainland are interested in establishing in Newfoundland. He said he hoped to see the proposed mill established shortly after the next session of the House.

Trustee Board Meeting Hospital Services Ass'n

The board of Trustees of the Maritime Hospital Service Association which sponsors the Maritime Blue Cross-Blue Shield Plans for prepaid hospital-medical-surgical care held its semi-annual meeting in Moncton. Presiding at the session was Dr. J.A. MacDougall, of Saint John.

Reports were received from the various committees headed by the chairman, Dr. MacDougall, G.M. McKel, John N. Flood, of Saint John; Dr. J.C. McMillan, M.A. Farmer, Q.C. Charlottetown; W.E. Fiske, Moncton; Dr. D.A. Thompson, Bathurst; and J.A. Comear, Meteghan River, N.S.

A member of the Board, W.R. Fiske, Moncton, has been named to represent the Maritime Hospital Service Association on the re-activated Arbitration Board.

The Board has authorized the implementation of more comprehensive contracts to meet the demands of present group subscribers who wish to avail themselves of extended benefits and more comprehensive protection.

In the first six months of the fiscal year, the Blue Cross-Blue

Shield Plan has paid out on behalf of subscribing members for hospital and medical services \$3,500,000. Realizing that this amount exceeds income from membership dues and faced with the prospect of further increases in the cost of hospital, surgical-medical benefits, an increase in membership rates must be made at an early date.

There are 294,565 Blue Crosses and 169,000 are enrolled in Blue Shield. In all there are three and a half million Canadians now enrolled in the voluntary, non-profit Blue Cross Plan for hospital care.

The M.H.S.A. Board meeting received a report that the consulting actuary, Allen B. Thompson vice-president and actuary of the Associated Hospital Service (Blue Cross) of New York, has been working in conference with Maritime Plan directors. Another important report received was that of C. Rufus Rorem, Ph.D., C.P.A. of Philadelphia, on the pilot study he undertook for Maritime Blue Cross earlier this year on hospital costs and utilization.

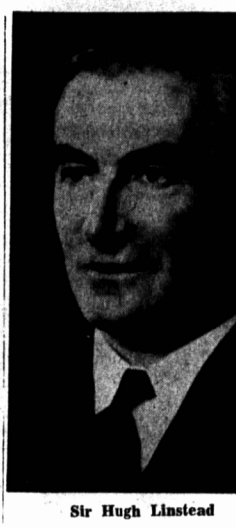
Born in 1901, he was educated at the City of London School, won the Jacob Bell Scholarship to the Pharmaceutical Society's School and later attended Birbeck College.

After a short time in practice, he became a demonstrator under Professor Greenish and in 1925 was made assistant secretary of the Pharmaceutical Society. He succeeded to the position of secretary and registrar in 1926.

The same year he was involved in negotiations between the Society and the government which firmly established supervision of the profession in the council of the Society.

Before the outbreak of World War II, and during hostilities, he assisted in the emergency preparation of the profession to serve both armed forces and civilians, and was secretary of the Pharmaceutical War Committee 1939-46.

Other professional roles: member of the Central Health Services Council in the British Ministry of Health; member of the Committee on Internal Administration of Hospitals (C.H.S.C.); member of the Council of the School of Pharmacy, University of London; president of the British section of the Franco-British Pharmaceutical Commission.

Top Liberals Quell Criticism Of Gov't. By Young Liberals

WINNIPEG (CP)—Quebec delegates with red berets and kilted bagpipe players from Nova Scotia set a gay atmosphere when the three-day national convention of the Young Liberal Federation of Canada opened Thursday.

But when the convention settled down to business top leaders of both the federal government and the young Liberals attempted to tone down proposed criticism of the senior liberals.

Federation officials admitted that a small group of Manitoba young Liberals were annoyed at the government's handling of the natural gas pipeline debate in the House of Commons. The group apparently hoped to drum up enough support among delegates to get a resolution to this effect on the convention floor.

Justice Minister Garson, who will address the convention today has said he will support the government on its pipeline stand and its parliamentary methods "to the hilt."

He said he was willing to take on any opposing group in debate. Faced with federal cabinet opposition, the Manitoba group appeared unlikely to force its proposal. Resolutions committee chairman Joe O'Sullivan said no resolution condemning the pipeline procedure of the government had been received by the committee.

The Quebec delegation, headed by John Pepper, 28, of Montreal, a candidate for the federation's presidency this year, will direct a resolution at the government's immigration policy. It will urge that immigrants be instructed in both the English and French language and the history, laws and institutions of Canada.

Opposing Mr. Pepper in presidential elections to be held Saturday is Roy Power of Halifax.
