The coldest temperatures for many years, possibly as low as any previously recorded, were experienced in Western Prince County Tuesday night. Many Alberton residents reported temperatures of 26 below zero at Min- night. At the home of several persons living in valleys, Fred Hardy's at Woodvale, Bert Rix's at Lawrence and at Huntley a record 30 below was reported. Despite a complete absence of wind, anyone outside at a late hour quickly realized that they were experiencing unusually frigid weather. Last night the weather moderated and a light snow was falling.

### Let's Talk It Over

All those interested in the welfare of education on Prince Edward Island should greet with renewed hope the news that St. Dunstan's University is beginning a course in teacher training. The new step should increase the supply of qualified teachers on Prince Edward Island to some extent. In the last analysis, of course, the rewards, monetary and otherwise, of a profession is its strongest lure, but the fact that S.D.U. students will be able to take normal training in conjunction with their university courses should increase the number of teachers who use the teaching profession as a stepping stone to other vocations. Considering the desperate straits in which the teaching profession finds itself at present here, surely no one will be too much perturbed at the idea of increasing the number of "stepping stone" teachers.

Men high in government circles of the past ten years or so have given it as their opinion that the profession of teaching was only a "stepping stone" to more remunerative professions anyway. These new teachers will be properly qualified at any rate, and therefore superior to many of those recruited into the profession through our "desperation policy" of the past few years. You can always keep the schools open in a province if you are willing to reach low enough for available "talent". In the twilight days of the Canadian scene the desperate need for teachers was met by recruiting old soldiers and others who could "read and write a little". In this day and age we should probably have never gone that far down the ladder, but we were certainly headed in that direction. This new project brings hope that we are on the threshold of better days.

### Dismiss Hit And Run Case

The case of a man from Borden charged with hit and run driving was dismissed in Magistrate's Court at Summerside yesterday by Magistrate R.S. Hinton, Q.C., at the conclusion of the trial in which three crown witnesses gave evidence. No witnesses were called by the defence. The charge resulted from an accident at Summerside East on the evening of October 11th, 1956, in which a half-ton truck driven by Mrs. Maude MacEwen, who was driving in an easterly direction, was side swiped by a car going west that failed to stop. However, the trial evidence revealed that the driver of the car which failed to stop was not identified. Mr. Neil MacLeod acted for the Crown and Mr. Harold Goodwin was attorney for the accused.

### Four New Canadians Receive Certificates Of Citizenship

Four new Canadians received certificates of citizenship from Judge W.E. Darby at a ceremony in the Court House, Summerside yesterday morning. They are Dr. Lech Karol Zielski, his wife, Mrs. Jania Zielski and her mother, Mrs. Jania Anna Mikrowicz all of Kensington and Williams MacGregor Parker of Summerside. E.P. Foley, M.L.A., Morley M. Bell, M.L.A. and W. Chester S. MacDonald barrister, were present for the ceremony. Judge Darby also presented each new Canadian with a congratulatory letter from Immigration Minister Pickersgill and a Bible, after which he welcomed them as citizens of Canada. Judge Darby stated that the people of Canada come from many countries and "although we don't ask them to be alike or to cast aside their traditions, we do ask them to be good citizens."

He told them they naturally have affection for their former countries, but now Canada must be their first allegiance. Judge Darby also related some of the privileges and responsibilities of Canadian citizenship. Mr. Bell and Mr. Foley also voiced warm welcomes to the four new citizens or the adoption of Canada as their future home. Dr. Zielski was born in Poland in 1913 and studied medicine in Warsaw from 1932 to 1939 when the war interrupted the writing of his final examinations. After serving in the Polish army during which he was captured by the Germans and held in concentration camps, Dr. Zielski completed his studies in Beirut, Lebanon in 1945 and was married in the same
