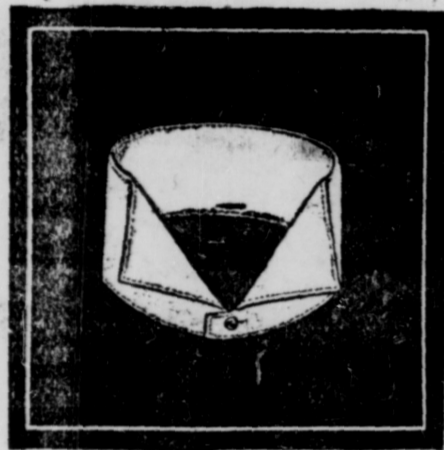




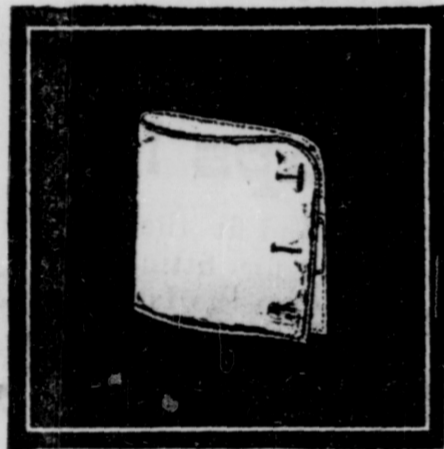

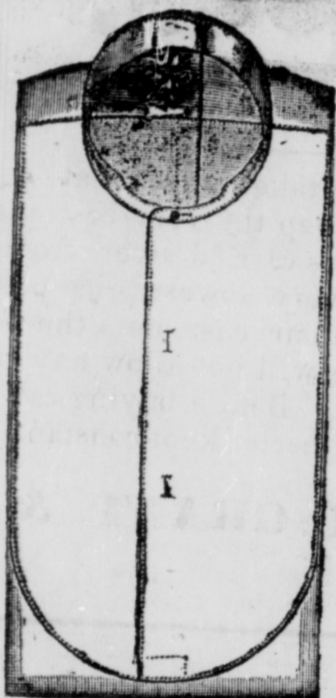

PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Tariff Discussion in the House of Commons.

Senator Wark Favors an Imperial Customs Union.

OTTAWA, June 4.—The House in committee on the tariff passed the combines clause after defeating the amendment. The tariff schedules were then taken up. The liquor schedule passed. Clarke Wallace held that the excise duty ought to be increased, as the distillers had too much protection.

On the agricultural list, when the item of mutton and other meats came up, Mr. Foster asked if the preferential rate was allowed to New South Wales.

Hon. Mr. Fielding said that it would be. Then Mr. Foster showed that British Columbia would be largely supplied with meat from that country.

A remarkable event occurred in the history of the country yesterday when the venerable Senator Wark, notwithstanding his ninety three years, addressed the Senate for nearly an hour in support of an imperial customs union. He favors free trade within the empire and protection against the rest of the world.

The Minister of Justice has abandoned the principle of his bill limiting the rate of interest to eight per cent. Yesterday he struck out all the original clauses and substituted a clause providing that when a note is given for a less period than a year it should state plainly the annual rate per cent payable thereon.

HALIFAX, June 2.—Spencer Kiffin, jr., and James Mamborn, while out fishing yesterday, had their boat upset by heavy seas and both were drowned. John Burk and Wallace Hudson were also drowned yesterday while attending lobster traps.

TORONTO, June 2.—The grand chief of the Sons of Scotland has issued a circular to all the camps throughout the country calling upon them to arrange for bonfires in their respective localities on the evening of June 23 in honor of the Queen's Jubilee. There will be a chain of bonfires from ocean to ocean, as the camps extend from Halifax to Vancouver.

BRUSSELS, June 2.—Official news was received here today from the Congo Free State saying that a Belgian force had defeated 2,000 Mahdists in the northern part of that territory.

LONDON, June 2.—A special despatch from Athens announces that the Turks have retired from the Othrays mountains to the Plains of Thessaly, owing to the difficulty of transporting rations to the troops.

ATLANTA, Ga., June 2.—Mrs. Godfrey, 40 years old, the handsome and wealthy daughter of Hon. Benjamin Dugger, has been arrested for murder. She was indicted on the testimony of her child, who swore that six years ago she strangled and buried her daughter's illegitimate child.

HALIFAX, June 2.—An interesting wedding took place last afternoon at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Honanley, the bride being the mother of Mrs. Hoadley and widow of Mr. A. A. Lufkin, of Walnut Hill, Me. She is 77 years old. The bridegroom is T. T. Lufkin, of Sacramento, Cal., brother of the deceased husband. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. W. W. Rainey, of the Park Church. The bridal couple will spend their summers in Maine and their winters in Sacramento. The bridegroom is 79 years of age.
