

# Descendant of John Cabot Plans Voyage Next Year

LONDON CP—A modern descendant of explorer John Cabot plans to sail from Bristol, England, to St. John's, Nfld., next May to mark the 400th anniversary of the original voyage.

Philip Cabot, a British traveller and writer, hopes to cross the Atlantic in three weeks in a 71-foot ocean-going lifeboat, arriving at St. John's "if I possibly can" May 4, known in Britain as Empire Day.

His plan, conceived 10 weeks ago, then is to cruise down the St. Lawrence to attend a ceremony in June at the John Cabot monument in Montreal.

"I have written to the Cabot society in Montreal and to Premier Joseph Smallwood in Newfoundland to let them know of my plans," Cabot said Thursday.

The original Cabot, a Genoese sailor-adventurer who came to London about 1484, sailed with Henry VII's blessing from Bristol May 2, 1497, in a small ship called the *Matthew*. He found Newfoundland and thought it was Asia.

Now his direct descendant plans to duplicate the voyage. His lifeboat will be named *Matthew VI*. "You'll find the reason in the Bible," says Cabot. "Matthew, chapter six, is the last half of the sermon on the Mount, and gives a philosophy of life that stands well today."

The 1956 voyager will have a

crew of six with him, including a professional engineer, a movie cameraman and a radio operator. "It isn't a stunt," he adds. "I'd like to commemorate the old boy's journey and try to strengthen the links between Canada and Britain, to show the significance of the Commonwealth and Empire."

Cabot first thought of the Atlantic mission in 1947—the 450th anniversary of John Cabot's trip. "I couldn't make the trip then, and I can't wait for the 500th anniversary, so we're going in 1957." He is in his 50s.
